Streetscaping

September Maintenance Report here. Annual plants are to be removed by October 30th. Also, starting October 30th, we will reduce maintenance labour hours to two weekly visits. Winter planter installation will begin on **November 13** (weather permitting) and will be complete on **November 17** - right on time for the opening of Window Wonderland.

Our research shows that restaurant patrons contribute significantly to cigarette butt litter which is time-consuming to clean up. To address this issue, we're launching the **ButtOut Clean Streets**Initiative, a pilot program to encourage responsible disposal of cigarette butts. Beginning by installing six outdoor smoker receptacles, the goal is to free up more of PGT's time for essential tasks like weeding and maintaining our neighbourhood. Ongoing.

Perennial Pilot Project on Heintzman

In our native Perennial Pilot Project, we've witnessed significant success. However, we are exercising caution and giving it more time before proceeding with the complete replacement of all our annuals with perennials. Our primary goal is to guarantee a successful transition. PollinateTO has voiced concerns about the planter boxes' depth, which might not accommodate the native perennial root systems. Consequently, they have yet to support us with a grant for this initiative. We seek guidance from an expert to make informed choices regarding the perennials for our Butterfly Gardens.

Butterfly Gardens

To keep a clean and more well-maintained look to our Butterfly Gardens, we have asked PGT to increase their upkeep of the perennial butterfly gardens. There will be more pruning and shaping as long as it does not affect the late fall blooms, a major life source for migrating pollinators. **Starting in the spring of 2024, there will be regular monthly check-ins with BIA staff and PGT workers to ensure the gardens are maintained to our satisfaction.**

City Trees

The TABIA office has also faced challenges booking a meeting with the Urban Forestry (UF) department. This concern is shared with other BIAs across Toronto, and we are eagerly awaiting a response from UF and Rebecca at the BIA Office. **Ongoing. Jenna to follow up.**

Benches

The bench at Epic Cycles has been removed, and it is currently in storage with plans for its future installation at the Old Stonehenge development, The Pacific at 2968 Dundas St W. Regrettably, we have encountered an issue with graffiti on our 34 new benches, which is disheartening to witness. It is crucial to protect our community assets from such defacement. We conducted a walkabout and saw that 21 benches showed signs of graffiti and staining, which must be removed by sanding per the manufacturer's instructions. Now that the wood has aged, to prevent this from becoming a

recurring problem, we've secured a quote of ~\$5,500. from Sure, the city's contractor who installed the benches, to apply an **anti-graffiti coating** to all benches this month. However, if weather is a factor, we will consider completing the work in the spring of 2024. Ongoing.

CaféTO

Patios were deconstructed and removed by the City on **October 11**. The removal date was subject to change due to unexpected weather, road emergencies or any other delay beyond our control. We have provided our feedback to the City, including operators' comments. Ongoing.

Grants

We did not receive funding from the **stART Partnership program**. Additionally, we are no eligible for the **PollinateTO grant** since we are not expanding or creating any new butterfly gardens next year.
