Review the previous lesson: How many disciples did Jesus have at the Last Supper? Discuss the children's responses to introduce today's lesson. Ask children how they feel when their siblings and friends treat them badly.

Jesus has power over death, and through His resurrection, we can also come to the Father when we accept Christ.
