Intro Summary to Topic	In this session created by Kumi Watanabe-Schock, Dr. Robin Kimmerer offers insight into traditional ecological knowledge. She explores the importance of incorporating multiple ways of knowledge in classrooms to challenge the limited notion that Western ways of knowing are the best and only credible ways to look at ourselves and our relationships in the world. In the video clip we watch, Kimmerer talks about her experience in college in the sciences as well as about the braiding of sweetgrass and the meaning of the three strands.
