Superlatives & Comparatives - أفعل الأمريكية - أفعل التفضيل التفضيل

Whenever tourist sites are described, these descriptions are usually full of superlatives and comparatives.

But what does that mean?!

The superlative means: of, pertaining to, or noting the highest degree of the comparison of adjectives and adverbs. Smallest, best, and most carefully are the superlatives of small, good, and carefully.

Comparatives means words that compare two things, such as 'smaller than that city' and 'better than that museum.'

We are only learning the basic form of superlatives and comparatives in Arabic! Because they follow a basic form:

the - - pattern, where the three blanks are the root.

جمیل \rightarrow أجمل pretty; prettiest tall; tallest a little; the fewest

أحسن doesn't fit this pattern (just like English) - جيد \leftarrow أحسن good; best

Here are some examples from our text:

يوجد أفضل شارع في العالم

there is the best street in the world

وأشهر شاطئ منطقة سانتا مونيكا

and the most famous beach is the Santa Monica region

Note that superlatives don't take an \perp even though they do in English (<u>the</u> largest, <u>the</u> smallest, etc.)

Here are more superlatives in action:

The biggest city أكبر مدينة

أحسن أستاذة في العالم The best professor in the world

What about comparatives?

What if you want to say "a bigger room than his" or "a better professor than that mean one", i.e. compare two things? JUST ADD A من

It is counted as **among the most beautiful** cities of the state of California, or **the most beautiful**.

Notice here that the final superlative DOES have an الأجمل in the word الأجمل - this is because of the way the sentence is structured (after the word أو here).
