OPEN GYMS & TRYOUTS & OFFERS

The Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy annually conducts open gyms and tryouts to identify and select talented players for our esteemed club teams. Specifically, open gyms for girls' teams are typically scheduled in July, September and October, culminating in tryouts at the end of July, October and/or early November.

We continuously evaluate players during both official tryouts and informal sessions like open gyms. Our coaches record players' performance, attitude, and interactions during these

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sessions. Selecting teams is a comprehensive process, and we consider all interested players. Official tryout dates primarily help us observe how new and returning players interact and behave together.

The final team selections are reviewed and approved by Director Jaime Lizarazu based on all the data provided by coaches, from video footage, and from player and family past experience within our Academy.

Our commitment to fair and comprehensive evaluation remains steadfast, ensuring that every aspiring athlete has an equitable opportunity to showcase their talents and contribute to the continued success of The Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy.

Selection Process

The selection process for Driven Dragons Club teams is grounded in a comprehensive evaluation, considering various key criteria to ensure the assembly of dedicated and skilled players. The criteria for selection include:

Player Behavior and Performance:

Evaluation of behavior and performance during open gyms and tryouts, encompassing skill level, effort, and collaborative interaction with fellow players.

Past Volleyball Experiences:

An assessment of an individual's history and experiences in the realm of volleyball, acknowledging the depth of their involvement and growth within the sport.

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Positive Parental Involvement or Behavior:

Recognition of a positive history of parental involvement and behavior, acknowledging the crucial role that supportive families play in the holistic development of young athletes.

Good Standing with Governing Bodies and with Driven Dragons:

Ensuring participants maintain good standing with Driven Dragons, as well as with the Keystone Region Volleyball Association (KRVA), Amateur Athletic Union (AAU), and USA Volleyball. Compliance with the rules, regulations, policies, and guidelines of these organizations is a fundamental expectation.

KRVA:

The Keystone Region Volleyball Association (KRVA), operating as a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization, serves as the governing body for USA Volleyball clubs in Pennsylvania. Adherence to KRVA rules and regulations is mandatory for all affiliated teams.

USA Volleyball:

 Recognized as the national governing body of volleyball in the United States, USA Volleyball operates under the auspices of the Fédération Internationale de Volleyball and the United States Olympic Committee.

AAU:

 The Amateur Athletic Union (AAU), a multi-sport organization dedicated to promoting and developing amateur sports and

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physical fitness programs, represents another essential governing body for our athletes.

Driven Dragons

 ★ To be in good standing with the Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy, athletes, and their families should be aligned with this handbook.
 Families must be current on payments to the Academy to continue to participate in events. Failure to abide by this handbook can result in temporary to permanent suspension from the Academy.

Coachability:

An evaluation of an individual's coachability, recognizing the ability to receive feedback, implement guidance, and continuously improve.

Potential:

Recognition of the untapped potential and the capacity for growth and development, affirming the commitment to fostering the advancement of each player.

Through this meticulous selection process, we aim to form teams composed of not only skilled athletes but also individuals who embody the values and standards upheld by Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy.

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Offer Letters

Formal offers for participation in the Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy are conveyed with the utmost professionalism and transparency. These offers are disseminated exclusively through email and are released in accordance with the Keystone Region's (KRVA) designated date and time protocol.

It is essential to note that, irrespective of when a player undergoes a tryout before this date, the formal decision will only be communicated on or after the official date set by the Keystone region, or potentially a few days thereafter. The formal offer will be directed to the primary contact/parent/guardian's email address, and a prompt response is requested within 48 hours to indicate acceptance or decline of the offer.

The comprehensive offer will encompass all pertinent details for the season, including tuition information and the scope of coverage. We encourage a swift decision-making process, as the release of offers is interconnected with other aspiring players eagerly awaiting their opportunity. It is imperative to recognize that all accepted offers are considered financially committed under a formal contract, solidifying the commitment to a mutually rewarding and successful season ahead.

Compassion Clause - ages 14 and under:

At the Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy, our commitment to player development goes beyond the selection process. We recognize the inherent value and potential within every player, and our Compassion Clause ensures that each participant is provided with a pathway for growth and engagement within our club.

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For players falling within the 10-14U age definition who may not secure a spot on our Regional/National Teams during the club tryout season, we extend an invitation to join our Pilot Club Teams. The Pilot Team, our developmental league, offers an enriching two-month program with weekly practices, including a uniform package and participation in one to two tournaments. Notably, the Pilot Team presents a cost-effective alternative compared to our Regional/National Teams.

In the event that the Pilot Team reaches full capacity, the player will be offered a position as a Practice Player on the Pilot Team. While Practice Players do not receive a uniform package or attend team tournaments, they benefit from attending practices to enhance their skills for the next level. In rare instances where we exceed capacity for both Pilot Teams and Practice Players, families will be put on a waiting list to attend our upcoming clinics within the same club season year. These clinics, conducted in the Fall and Spring, offer continued skill development opportunities.

Loyalty Offers:

The Keystone Region Volleyball Association (KRVA) has granted clubs the opportunity to extend early offers to players who were part of the club during the previous season. In alignment with this provision, Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy has implemented Loyalty Offers for the upcoming season.

Loyalty offers, once accepted by the family, bond the athlete to the club for the upcoming season. It does nothing further in regard to guaranteeing which team the player will be assigned once the season starts. Athletes who accept loyalty offers are still required to attend tryouts, so Driven Dragons Leadership can determine which team makes sense for the athlete's current skills, abilities, and attitude. A loyalty offer

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acceptee must pay 1 tryout fee for the upcoming season, however, they are granted free play in the summer "Driven" league, as our way of saying Thank you for your Loyalty. A tryout is still required for the loyalty player, as we need to determine which team is a best fit. Team decisions are made as early as August, but no later than the end of November going into the new season.

The recipients of Loyalty Offers are chosen based on their embodiment of the Driven Dragon Values, creating an exemplary club experience for all involved. Those players and parents who consistently role-model our values and contribute significantly to the positive atmosphere within the club are typically selected for Loyalty Offers. We place a high value on individuals who not only excel on the court but also contribute to the overall enhancement of our club culture.

The Loyalty Offer email shall include high-level details of the next season, such as tuition amount, amount of practices per week, amount of tournaments, and coaches. However, included in this email is a statement that says, things that are out of our control, may change. By accepting this offer, you agree to this statement.

It is important to note that, in the spirit of transparency and encouragement, we actively endorse our players and parents to explore opportunities with other clubs in the area. We recognize that each athlete and family must make decisions that align with their aspirations and goals. Therefore, declining a Loyalty Offer is fully understandable, and we respect and support the choices that contribute to the best individual fit for each player and family.

As we move forward, the continuation of Loyalty Offers will be considered in subsequent seasons, reinforcing our commitment to recognizing and rewarding those who consistently exemplify the Driven Dragon Values and contribute to the collective success of our volleyball community. Page 17 of 60

Time Commitment:

TEAMS

Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy is committed to fostering a dynamic and supportive team environment. To achieve this, all teams within our academy are intentionally structured to consist of 9 to 11 players and 2 coaches. This deliberate roster size is designed with several key considerations in mind.

Firstly, recognizing the prevalence of multi-sport athletes within our program, we aim to strike a balance that accommodates the diverse commitments of our players. This approach ensures that each athlete can actively participate and contribute to the team while pursuing other interests.

Additionally, the consideration of potential injuries throughout the season underscores the importance of having a slightly larger roster. With a 9 to 11 player configuration, teams are better equipped to navigate any challenges that may arise, fostering an environment where players can support each other's growth and development.

By maintaining an optimal team size and coach-to-player ratio, we create a setting where individuals can not only excel in their volleyball skills but also form strong bonds, cultivate teamwork, and collectively overcome any obstacles that may arise during the season. This approach aligns with our commitment to providing a comprehensive and enriching experience for every participant in the Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy.

Pilot Teams

Our Pilot Teams apply only to the 10-14U age definition. Our Pilot Teams

- Season Duration: 2 months long (December and January with a winter break)
- Volleyball Team Practice 1 day a week for 2 hours in length at United Sports in Downingtown, PA
- Uniform Package
- Attend 1 tournament within 2 two-hour drive of Downingtown, PA
- Level of Competition: Low/Medium

Regional Teams

Our Regional Teams apply to the following age definition for the 2024-2025 club season:

12U, 13U, 14U, 15U, 16U, 17U,

- Requires a tryout
- Season Duration: 4 months long (December through March with a winter break)
- Volleyball Team Practice: 2 days a week, 1.15 to 2 hours each at United Sports in Downingtown, PA or a local YMCA in Exton, PA
- Strength & Conditioning Speed & Agility Training: 1 day a week, usually same day as volleyball practice
- Uniform Package (2 Jerseys, 2 Spandex/Shorts, Warm-ups, Practice T-shirt, BackPack)
- 4 to 6 tournaments (mostly multi-day, only on weekends) within a 2.5 hour drive of Downingtown, PA

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• Level of Competition: Medium/High

National Teams (The Dream Team)

The formation of our National Team(s) at Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy is a distinguished honor, reserved for players of exceptional merit. The nomination process for our Dream Team, which occurs during the Regional Season from December to March, is a meticulous and discerning selection based on specific criteria.

Players and their families who exhibit a strong alignment with our Dragon Values, coupled with a high volleyball IQ, stand out for consideration in the Dream Team. The values of commitment, sportsmanship, and excellence on and off the court play a pivotal role in the nomination process.

Between January and March, coaches will verbally and subsequently communicate via email with the parents of nominated players, extending an offer to join the Dream Team. This specialized team operates from April through June, culminating in the AAU Nationals in Orlando, Florida. Acceptance of the Dream Team offer includes a tuition increase, which covers the expanded season's various aspects.

The increased tuition encompasses practice facility time, dedicated speed and agility training, updated uniforms, coaching fees, as well as coaching travel and hotel expenses, along with tournament entry fees. This comprehensive package is designed to provide an elevated and enriching experience for the Dream Team members.

Upon accepting the Dream

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Team offer, players and parents will have until April 4, 2024, to fulfill the tuition. To support this financial commitment, Driven Dragons will offer fundraising options to help alleviate the cost burden and make this exceptional opportunity accessible to all qualified players.

The Dream Team represents a pinnacle experience at Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy, and we are committed to ensuring that each member of this elite team receives the necessary resources and support to thrive both on and off the volleyball court.

- Season Duration: 2.25 months long (extension from Regional Season, total 6.25 months long)
- Volleyball Team Practice: 2 days a week, 1.15 to 2 hours each at United Sports in Downingtown, PA
- Strength & Conditioning & Speed & Agility Training: 1 day a week, same day as volleyball practice
- Jersey Updates to reflect Dream Team
- 2 to 3 tournaments, 3 to 15 hours away, such as in NJ, MD, VA, FL. The Dream Team will attend AAU Nationals in Orlando, Florida, in June. (Total season tournaments including Regionals: 7 to 11)
- Level of Competition: High To ensure the players are challenged at the highest level, The Dream Team(s) may compete in a higher age group before attending nationals.

Note: By committing to any Driven Dragons club team, player families are financially committed to attending every tournament at their own expense.

Practices

Team Practice

- Pilot Team practices 1x a week.
- Regional/National practices 2x a week
- Team practices are usually 1.5 to 2 hours long and may consist of group skills practice with other teams, team-specific practice, or a joint practice and scrimmage with another Driven Dragons team (or other local club teams).
- Our practice facility for this season is at United Sports at 1426 Marshallton Thorndale Road, Downingtown, PA.

Strength & Conditioning & Speed & Agility Training

- This does not apply to our Pilot Team(s)
- Applies to our Regional/National Team(s)
- 1x a week at 45 minutes each session, may be combined with more than one Driven Dragon(s) Team
- This is performed 1 day a week, in United Sports on the same day as Volleyball Practice. This is run by Kinetic.

Practice Requirements

At Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy, commitment to excellence extends to our practice environment, and we have established specific guidelines to ensure a focused and productive

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atmosphere. We appreciate your cooperation in upholding these standards for the benefit of each player's development and the overall team dynamic:

Attendance and Punctuality:

- Players are expected to attend all scheduled practices promptly.
- In case of unavoidable conflicts, communicate any lateness, early departures, or absences to the coach via TeamSnap at the earliest convenience.

Timeliness:

• Practices will commence precisely on time. Players are expected to be punctual, allowing sufficient time for arrival.

Attitude and Engagement:

 Players are encouraged to have fun, work diligently, and demonstrate attentiveness and respect towards coaches and teammates throughout practice sessions.

Practice Attire:

• Driven Dragon Practice T-shirts are the required attire for all practice sessions. Cell Phone Policy:

• Cell phone use during practice is strictly prohibited unless express permission is granted by the coach.

Team Training:

• Attendance at team training sessions is mandatory for all players.

Communication with Parents:

• Players are advised not to engage in conversations with parents during practice to maintain focus and cohesion within the team.

Consequences for Violations:

- Violations of Driven Dragon Practice Requirements by players may result in consequences such as suspension or missed playtime at tournaments.
- Parents are expected to adhere to the guidelines, and violations may lead to suspension from practice sessions.

These guidelines are designed to create a positive and constructive training environment. We appreciate your commitment to these expectations, as they contribute significantly to the overall

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success and growth of each player and the collective strength of the Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy.

Canceled Practice:

Cancellation of practices is an infrequent but possible occurrence at Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy, typically arising from weather conditions or facility scheduling conflicts. Although every effort will be made to arrange makeup sessions for canceled practices, it's important to note that this may not always be feasible.

Factors such as weather-related issues or unforeseen conflicts with facility schedules are beyond our control. In the event of a canceled practice, we will communicate any available options for makeup sessions if circumstances permit. However, please understand that makeup opportunities may only be possible on occasion.

Your understanding and flexibility in such situations are appreciated, and we are committed to providing the best possible solutions when faced with practice cancellations. We encourage you to stay informed through our communication channels for timely updates regarding any changes to the practice schedule.

Tournaments

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Driven Dragons:

- Pilot Teams will compete in 1 tournament across their season.
- Regional Teams will compete in 5 to 7 tournaments across their season.
- National/Dream Teams will compete in 2 to 3 tournaments across their season.

Tentative team schedules for Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy will be made available on our website during tryouts, providing an initial overview of the upcoming season. It's essential to note that these schedules are subject to change based on factors such as tournament availability and other scheduling issues.

While we strive to provide a preliminary schedule during tryouts, the dynamic nature of volleyball tournaments may necessitate adjustments. We appreciate your understanding and flexibility in such situations.

By accepting a position on a Driven Dragons team, players are committing to attend all tournaments, even those not initially outlined in the preliminary schedule. This commitment ensures the team's cohesion and maximizes participation opportunities for each player. We appreciate your dedication to the team and look forward to an exciting and successful season together.

Please stay connected with the Driven Dragons website and TeamSnap App for the most up-to-date and accurate information regarding team schedules and any potential changes throughout the season.

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Regional Tournaments

For Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy, local tournaments are defined as those within a 65 mile drive from our practice facilities. Unlike tournaments that necessitate overnight stays, local tournaments generally do not require hotel accommodations. However, it's worth noting that some families may choose to arrange nearby lodging the night before a competition at their discretion.

Importantly, no travel arrangements will be facilitated by Driven Dragons staff for local tournaments. Families are encouraged to plan their own logistics, including transportation and accommodation preferences, for these events. ****Exception: Once in awhile, Driven Dragons may submit a regional team into a stay and play event. This is a tournament that is over a 65 mile radius from our practice facility, that requires the team to stay overnight at the event in their selected hotels. Driven Dragons will share a link that accesses a room block, in which player's families will need to book their hotel stay through this link, in order for the team to attend this event. The entire team (each family) is required to purchase their rooms through the room block link, in order for the team to attend stay and play events during the <u>regional</u> season, although, once in awhile, we like to try out new events that may require stay and play. Teams will be given as much notice in advance if a stay an play event is on their radar.**

This approach allows for flexibility and autonomy in making personalized arrangements while ensuring that families have the freedom to tailor their tournament experience according to their individual needs and preferences.

National/Dream Team Tournaments:

For families accepting the nomination to the Dream Team at Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy, there is a tuition bump requirement to continue into the National season. The additional tuition aims to support the extended season's various components, including enhanced training, speed and agility sessions, updated uniforms, coaching fees (pay, travel, etc), and tournament entry fees.

Recognizing the financial commitment involved, fundraising options will be made available to assist families in managing this tuition bump, ensuring accessibility and flexibility.

When the Dream Team participates in local tournaments, the same guidelines and rules that apply to Regional Tournaments will be in effect. However, in instances where the Dream Team attends non-local tournaments—those exceeding a 65 mile drive from our practice facility—player families are solely responsible for covering all travel and hotel costs for both players and parents.

This approach provides transparency and allows families to plan accordingly for any non-local tournament participation, ensuring that each family has the flexibility to make personalized arrangements based on their preferences and circumstances.

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Canceled Tournaments:

While Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy makes every effort to adhere to the planned tournament schedule, unforeseen events can occasionally lead to tournament cancellations or a team not being accepted to play. In such instances:

Replacement of Canceled Tournaments:

- If a tournament is canceled for any reason, Driven Dragons will make an attempt to replace it with a similar event.
- However, finding a suitable alternative tournament is not always possible.

No Refunds for Canceled Tournaments:

- No refunds will be issued for a canceled tournament, as efforts will be made to provide an alternative event to maintain the team's competitive schedule.
 Player/Family Costs Responsibility:
 - Driven Dragons is not responsible for covering any player or family costs, including airline fees or hotel costs, associated with canceled tournaments.
 - Families are encouraged to consider travel insurance or other protective measures to mitigate potential financial impacts in the event of cancellations.

This policy is designed to communicate the Academy's approach to handling unforeseen circumstances related to tournament cancellations. The emphasis is placed on finding suitable alternatives whenever feasible, with the understanding that refunds and coverage of associated costs may not always be possible due to factors beyond our control.

Tournament Policies

Driven Dragons Club Teams prioritize competition at the highest level during tournaments, emphasizing player focus and commitment. To maintain maximum focus during team competitions, the following rules are established for both preparedness and attitude and behavior:

Preparedness:

Punctuality:

• Players are expected to arrive on time for all tournaments, warm-ups, and matches.

• Late arrivals may result in potential loss of playing time at the coach's discretion. Sleep and Nutrition:

• Players commit to getting adequate sleep before tournaments and maintaining proper nutrition during the event.

Uniforms:

• Players must bring their full uniform, including all jerseys, to every tournament to ensure eligibility for playing time.

Warmups:

- Players should wear complete warmups when entering the tournament venue. Neatness:
 - Backpacks should be lined up neatly in designated areas at the court or camping area.

Hydration:

• Players are encouraged to have adequate water at the tournament for proper hydration during matches.

Timeliness:

• Being on time for Driven Dragon players is defined as arriving 10 minutes early and being ready to play.

Attitude & Behavior:

Representing the Club:

Cell/Smart Phones:

• Cell/smartphones must be removed during warmups, competition, and work duties. Violation may result in the player sitting out the next set with no exceptions.

Camp Areas:

• Camp areas are to be kept neat.

Interaction with Officials:

• Players and parents must refrain from arguing with officials, including player-line judges and scorekeepers. Disputes over scores should be handled by players and coaches only.

Communication with Coaches:

• Parents must avoid approaching coaches about playing time, position, or disputes during a tournament.

Officiating Assignments:

All players must assist with line-judging, scorekeeping, score-flipping, and down
officiating. No headsets or cell phones are allowed during officiating
assignments.

These rules are established to ensure a focused and respectful tournament environment, promoting the values and standards of the Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy. Adherence to these guidelines contributes to a positive experience for all participants.

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Team Unity:

Team togetherness is a core principle at Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy, fostering a sense of unity and camaraderie among players and parents during tournaments. The following guidelines are in place to reinforce team cohesion and positive interactions:

At Driven Dragons, our pledge includes:

Play Time Criteria Breakdown

Pilot Development Teams

• Everyone gets playtime, depending on the player's position in the game, amount of time-outs used, rotations, game and sideline behavior, it may vary among the team.

Regional Teams

- Tournament Pool Play
 - Pool play consists of the initial games we play in a tournament. Each team competes against each other to determine who will make it to the playoffs and, if so, which division of playoffs the team falls into.
 - Who Plays in Pool Play:
 - There are only 6 positions on our side of the volleyball court and 9 to 11 players on a team. Our coaches will make sure everybody gets playtime. Our lineup should allow everyone to play in the first two games of each match during pool play. The winning lineup

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plays the third game if there is a third game. (There may be exceptions to this rule at the coach's discretion.)

- Tournament Bracket Play
 - Bracket play is the playoffs of a tournament. It is when teams are divided into groups and face off against each other in successive rounds until one team emerges as champion.
 - Who plays in Bracket Play?
 - The Coaches determine bracket play time as to who has best modeled the Dragon Values during Pool Play. The more the players model the Dragon Values during Pool Play, the more the players will play in bracket play and vice versa. This approach teaches leadership and perseverance.

National/Dream Teams

- Our National Teams are considered more competitive than our Regional Teams.
 Our National Teams Tournament Play Time Criteria (Bracket and Pool Play) are determined by their Coaches based on how well the Athlete aligns with the Dragon Values (see Dragon Values listed above). And a few other factors as well:
 - Physical Ability: Volleyball foundations/Technique
 - Volleyball IQ: Making intelligent plays, strategizing, and capitalizing on opportunities

- Attendance: Volleyball is a weird sport, has funny rules and many exceptions, and takes time & effort to learn. Volleyball is a team sport requiring players to learn set plays, rotations, switches, substitutions, etc.
 Placing an athlete who needs to catch up on instructions frustrates the Athlete and hurts the team's chemistry. It reduces the fun coefficient.
- Position: The player's position determines their role in the team, which factors their playtime and place in the team's rotation.
- Attitude: A positive attitude during adversity wins games, tournaments, and hearts

Parents and Playing Time

The support of parents is integral to the success of individual players and the overall team at Driven Dragons Volleyball Academy. We kindly request parents to play a positive and encouraging role, fostering confidence and a constructive mindset in their players, regardless of their role within the team.

Key points regarding parental support include:

Maintaining a Positive Attitude:

 Encouraging parents to maintain a positive attitude and support their players, whether they are starting players receiving significant playing time or substitutes with fewer rotations.

Respecting Coach Authority:

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• Acknowledging that coaches and club leadership have the ultimate authority regarding team lineups and playing time decisions.

Communication Guidelines:

- Under no circumstances should parents discuss lineups or playing time with coaches, whether at tournaments, practices or through email or text.
 Addressing Concerns:
 - If a parent wishes to discuss playing time decisions, they should follow the outlined steps in the **People Success Policy** for a constructive and respectful resolution.

The technology package will be an additional fee ontop of the season tuition, which includes access to Balltime (Automatic Tracking of Stats per player, from Video Uploads) and Sports Recruits (Website to upload videos, create profile, research and connect with college coaches, get offers and commitments with colleges.)

We use to offer this option automatically for our National Teams, and was included in the National Tuition, but we learned, not everyone is interested in these tools. That said, we will make them available for anyone who opts in during registration.

As a coach, I am committed to Positive Coaching Alliance (PCA) principles and against a "win-at-all-cost" mentality. I aim to be a Double-Goal Coach® who strives to win while pursuing the more important goal of teaching life lessons through sports.

Please help me by reinforcing three principles:

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- 1) The ELM Tree of Mastery
- 2) Filling Emotional Tanks
- 3) Honoring the Game.

Here are some details on these principles.

The ELM Tree of Mastery

The ELM Tree of Mastery While winning is important and learning to compete is one of the major life lessons available through sports, not everyone can win every game. Still, youth athletes are winners, regardless of what the scoreboard says, when they pursue mastery of their sports. To remember key elements of mastery, PCA uses the acronym ELM for Effort, Learning, and Mistakes are OK. Youth athletes who keep these things in mind develop habits that will serve them well. As an added benefit, athletes coached toward Mastery tend to have reduced anxiety and increased self-confidence because they focus on things they can control. Therefore, they are more likely to have fun and perform better.

Here's how you can help:

- Tell your children it's OK to make a mistake.
- Tell them you appreciate their best effort even if they fall short of the desired result.
- Recognize that Mastery is hard work and an ongoing process that can fuel great conversations about sports and life with your children.

Filling Emotional Tanks

- An "Emotional Tank" is like the gas tank in a car. When it's empty, we go nowhere, but when it's full, we can go almost anywhere. The best fuel for an Emotional Tank is an average of five specific, truthful praises for each specific, constructive criticism. Here's how you can help:
- Encourage your children with specific tank fillers regardless of scoreboard results. Be honest, but remember the value of that 5:1 ratio. For every 1

correction, provide 5 positive compliments, where the 1 correction should be sandwiched between the compliments.

• Avoid an immediate and critical debrief right after the game.

Honoring the Game

To help remember the ideals of sportsmanship, which PCA calls "Honoring the Game," we talk about respecting ROOTS, an acronym for Rules, Officials, Opponents, Teammates, and Self. Here's how you can help:

- Review ROOTS with your children (you can learn more about the meaning of each letter by visiting PCA's website at <u>www.positivecoach.org</u>).
- Model Honoring the Game yourself as you watch your children compete and even as you watch sports on TV together.
- Encourage other spectators to Honor the Game. Pilot and Regional Club Teams:

Tournaments for these teams are limited to a maximum of a 65 mile drive from our practice facility.

Flights and hotels are not required for these tournaments.

If families choose to book a hotel for multi-day games, they are responsible for managing and covering the associated costs.

National/Dream Teams:

Tournaments for these teams may require travel beyond a 65 mile drive from our practice facility.

Families are responsible for planning and booking necessary travel and hotel accommodations promptly.

Travel and hotel costs are not included in the season tuition for National/Dream Teams.

Communication Method:

The primary mode of contacting families about hotels and travel arrangements is via email.

It is essential for families to check their email frequently, especially when aware that a team is attending a tournament requiring a hotel stay.

Hotel Information & Policies:

Driven Dragons may attempt to reserve one room per team member in a Hotel Block. Additional rooms required by families must be secured directly from the hotel and may not be at the same team rate.

Most travel events are considered Stay-to-Play, necessitating teams to book hotel rooms provided by the event to avoid expulsion.

Families must stay in the designated Team Hotel and comply with tournament hotel policies.

Players must book a room within the specific Hotel Block provided by the event. Failure to stay in the Team Hotel may result in the player being suspended from the tournament. Note: We strive to provide enjoyable travel experiences and clean, well-run hotels. While we cannot always control external factors, we appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to these policies. FLIGHT INFO & POLICIES:
