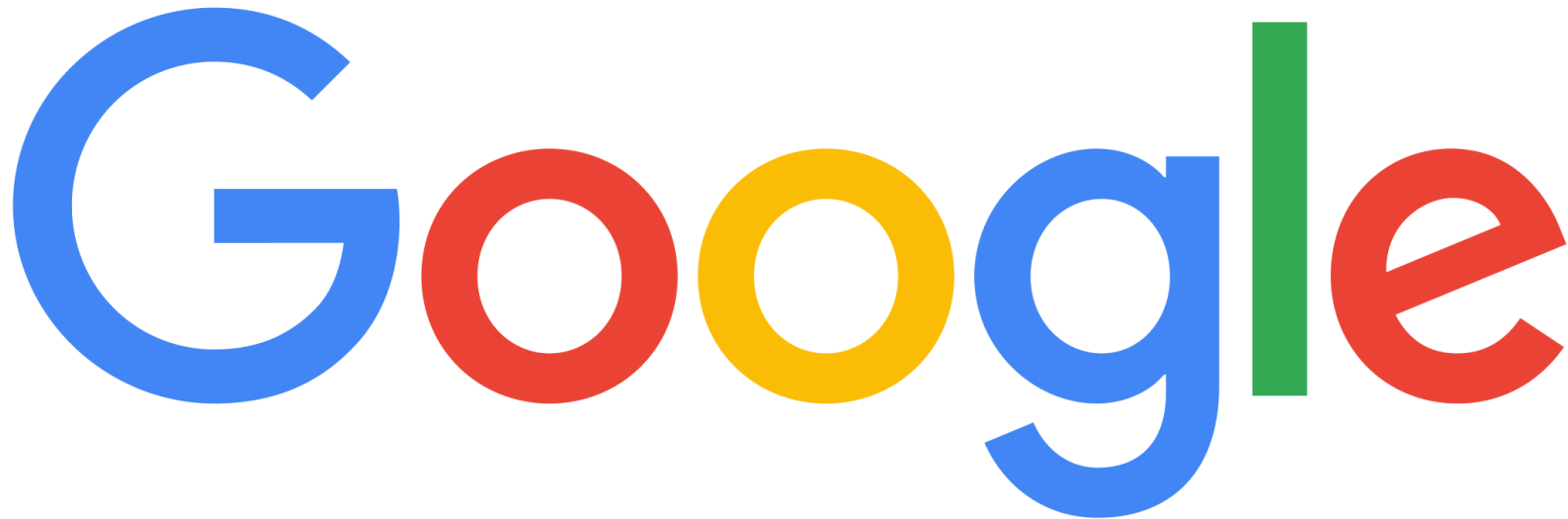




Add-ons are specific to Google Apps. Add-ons extend the basic functions of Google apps making them far more powerful.

Each app has different add-ons that are specific to that app. For example SAS Writing Reviser is for Google Docs, not Google Sheets.

To add any “add-on” to an application you must be in that application and click the “add-on” tab at the top.

Extensions are specific to Google Chrome (or any Chromium based) browser. Extensions provide amazing benefits and can help make tasks easier.

Below are some of the add-ons and extensions I use. There are many more available in the [Chrome Web Store](#) and I would encourage you to explore.

Add-ons for Docs

<u>Doc Tools</u>	A set of single-click tools to change case, highlight text, sort tables and lists, change numbers to text, and more.
<u>Grade Proof</u>	Artificially intelligent proofreading for Google Docs. Instantly correct spelling, grammar and phrasing with GradeProof.
<u>Orange Slice Rubric</u>	Teacher Rubric is an add-on that will increase your grading productivity and it professionally presents a scored rubric and grade for your students.
<u>Pro Writing Aid</u>	Improve your writing. Check your writing for consistency, plagiarism, acronyms, cliches, redundancies, grammar mistakes and more.
<u>SAS Writing Reviser</u>	This add-on provides students with feedback about their writing and enables them to address a range of potential writing problems, including weak verbs, excess prepositional phrases, dangling modifiers, and faulty sentence structure.
<u>WriQ</u>	WriQ is an Add-on from Texthelp that helps teachers score and keep track of students' spelling, punctuation and grammar errors so you can focus on the things computers can't score.
<u>Paperpile</u>	Add citations and bibliographies to your research paper. Simple, correct, fast and fully collaborative. Paperpile is a full-featured reference manager right in your Google Doc.

Add-ons for Sheets

<u>autoCrat</u>	AutoCrat is a multi-purpose document merge tool that allows you to take data from a spreadsheet and merge it into a document via a template.
<u>Doctopus</u>	Doctopus gives teachers the ability to mass-copy (from a starter template), share, monitor student progress, and manage grading and feedback for student projects in Google Drive.
<u>Flubaroo</u>	Flubaroo helps you quickly grade and analyze online assignments and assessments, as well as instantly share scores with students!
<u>formCreator</u>	Creates a Form directly from the contents of your Sheet. Create a form directly from the values in your spreadsheet.

Add-ons for Slides

<u>Pear Deck</u>	This add-on is a must have for every teacher! Transform existing Google Slides, PPTs or PDFs into interactive presentations, or choose to build your presentation from scratch. Add in temperature checks, formative assessments, discussion prompts, diagnostics, or exit tickets...and so much more!
<u>Unsplash Photos</u>	Insert free, HD photos from Unsplash easily in any Slides presentation. Unsplash is the world's premier community for HD photography. And the entire Unsplash library of curated high-resolution photos is now freely available directly in Google Slides for your presentations. ✓ Free ✓ Personal & Commercial use ✓ Copyright free

Extensions for Chrome

<u>Insert Learning</u>	Teachers can insert questions, discussions, and insight directly into any website. When students go to that website, they can respond to those questions and discussions, see that insight, and take their own notes.
<u>Google Quick Create</u>	Add a simple menu to your browser bar to quickly create new Documents, Spreadsheets, Presentations, Forms, and Drawings for Google Drive.
<u>Screencastify</u>	The #1 screen recorder for Chrome. Capture, edit and share videos in seconds.
<u>Grammarly</u>	Grammarly will make sure your messages, documents, and social media posts are clear, mistake-free, and impactful. Adding Grammarly to Chrome means that your spelling and grammar will be vetted on Gmail, Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, Tumblr, and nearly everywhere else you write on the web.
<u>TLDR: Summarize Anything</u>	TLDR Plugin extension provides a one-click way to get a condensed synopsis/summary view of news, blog posts, and other articles online for quick and easy reading. Powered by Liquid Helium, the plugin analyzes the content and creates summarized versions in four different lengths on any web page, including web

	applications such as web mail, Grammarly, EverNote, Google Translase, and many more.
