

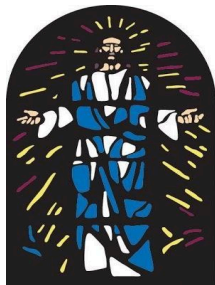



Christian Obituary for CW3 Wilford "Buzz" Nelson Verneau Jr. (ret. U.S. Army)

Buzz was born in Latrobe, PA on October 10, 1935 to Wilford Nelson Verneau, Sr. and Freda K. Jones. He was baptized on December 15, 1935 at Trinity Lutheran Church in Latrobe, PA. He was later Confirmed in his faith at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Trauger, PA. He married his wife, Nancy (Nan) Jean Forsha on October 16, 1954 at St. James Lutheran Church in Youngstown, PA. Together they were blessed with 5 children.

Buzz served his nation in the U.S. Army for 25 years before retiring as a Chief Warrant Officer. After his military career, he worked in civil service for 20 years before retiring a second time. Buzz was a faithful member of Our Redeemer Lutheran Church where he served as president and in many other ways. He also sang in the choir and acted in various skits throughout the years. He died on Sunday, May 8, 2022 at his residence in Harlem, GA. and is now home with His Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.
