THE VERB FOLLOWING 'SI' IS IN THE PRESENT INDICATIVE. NOTE THE SAME SENTENCE IN THE REVERSE ORDER: >>>> I will/am going to leave, if they come to the party,

## SALDRÉ SI ELLOS VIENEN A LA FIESTA

## Si + present indicative (THIS IS THE DEPENDENT CLAUSE), future (INDEPENDENT CLAUSE)

- 1. If the accountant works more, he will earn more money.

- 3. If we give up on the job, we will be poor
- 4. If you (s/fam) invest your money intelligently, you will always be rich.
- 5. If I fire the secretary, everyone will hate me.
- 6. If you (pl/form) stop the profession, this company will suffer
- 7. You (s/form) will fall down if you are not careful.
- 8. Those (far) architects will lose the plans if we take them home.
- 9. You (pl/fam) will not reduce your stress if you continue to lead an unhealthy life

- 10. Those (near) firemen will be in danger if they take off their special coats.
- 11. We'll do a lot of exercises if we arrive/get to the gym early tomorrow.
- 12. This reporter (M) wil be successful if he asks his questions politely.
- 13. I will not be on a diet if you (s/fam) accompany me to the party.
- 14. We will enjoy our trip to the mountains if we are in good health.
- 15. You (s/fam) will get fat if you eat too much this afternoon.
