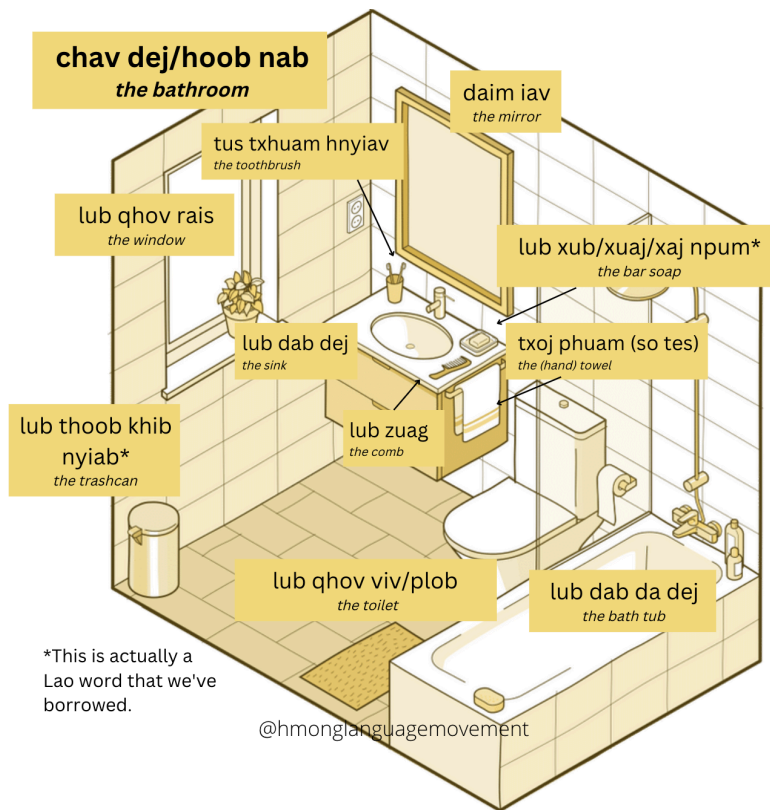

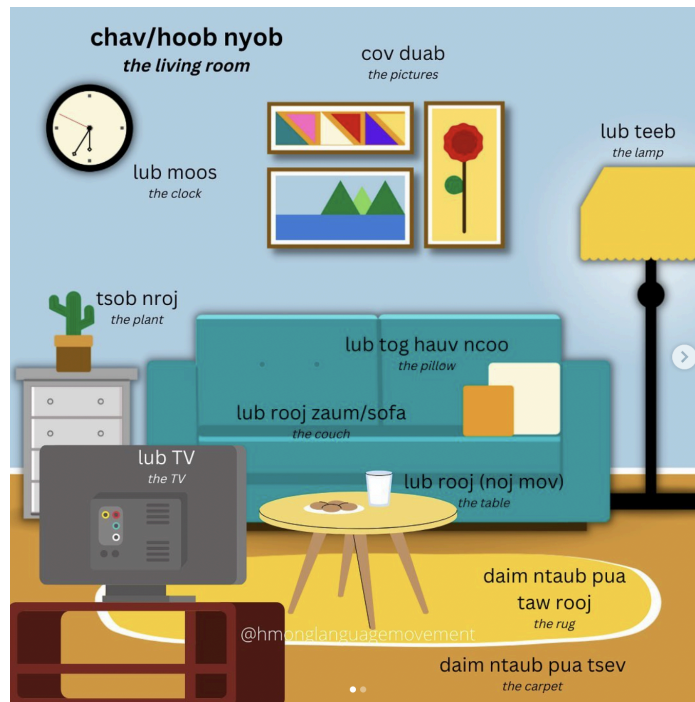

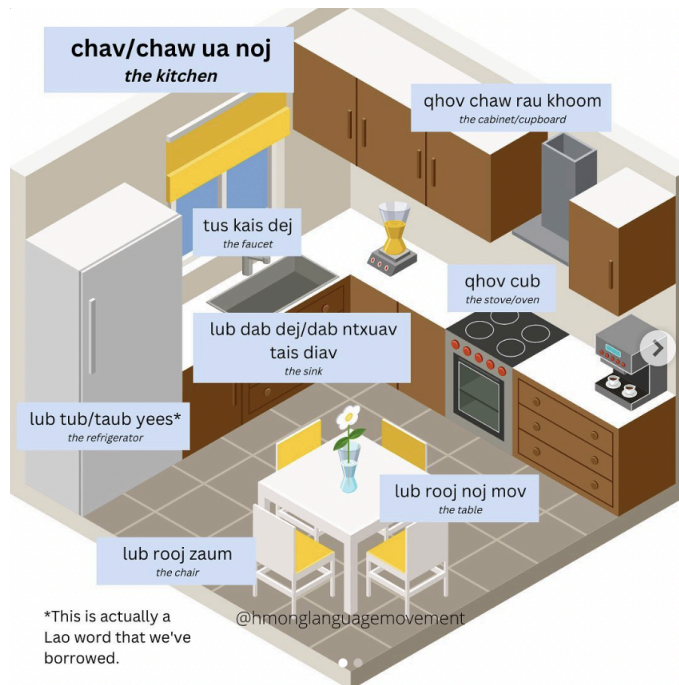

ntxuav tais diav	to wash the dishes
ntxhua khaub ncaws	to do the laundry/wash clothes
nqus tsev	to vacuum (the house)
txhuam tsev	to mop (the floor)
cheb tsev	to sweep (the house)
nqa khib nyiab mus pov tseg	to take out the trash
txhuam hoob nab/chav dej	to clean the bathroom
txiav nyom	to mow the lawn (literally "to cut grass")
pub qaib	to feed the chickens

Other vocabulary that might be useful:

pab	to help
puas kam	can/willing to

*Remember that if “puas” is used in a question, then it’s a yes/no question, so it’ll require a yes/no answer. To answer yes, say “kam.” To answer no, say “tsis kam.”

**This is a command, so it won’t need a yes/no answer.
