Facts About Me:

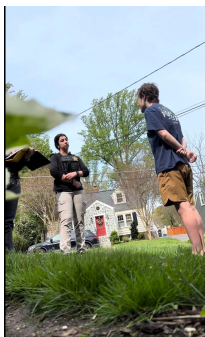

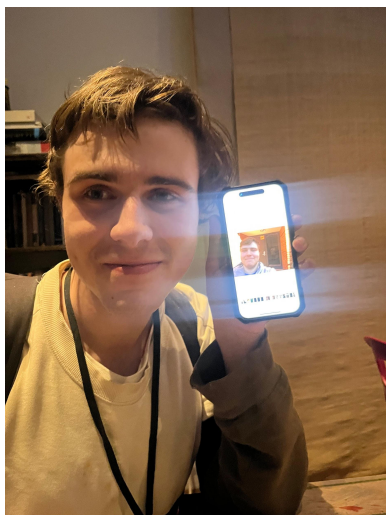
