

# Math Workshop:

This week students continued learning and practicing strategies for adding 2 digit numbers. Students also learned the importance of utilizing landmark numbers when adding.

Students were able to play "Roll-A-Square" and Dreambox this week.

#### Writer's Workshop:

Students read introductions and conclusions of nonfiction books. We then worked on adding our own intros and conclusions to our writing. 
#### Social Studies:

# Reader's Workshop:
