The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn Project Choices-Honors English III

Project Due: Friday, May 1st Test grade.

Projects will be graded on effort, creativity, neatness, and textual accuracy.

Choose one of the following project choices:

- 1) Create a scrapbook for Huck's adventures throughout the novel. The scrapbook should have 5 pages, with "mementos" from his journey (snapshots, pieces of fabric, newspaper clippings, etc.) and a neatly written paragraph (from Huck's perspective) for each artifact explaining its significance to Huck. It should look authentic (old/rugged in appearance)
- 2) A 5 page typed "extension"/epilogue of the novel. Choose a character from the novel and write a short story about what happens to that character after the novel ends.
- 3) A miniature re-creation of Huck and Jim's raft, including the wigwam and other specific raft details mentioned in the novel. Must include a ½ page typed explanation of the scene depicted and its significance. Make the raft, ocean, etc. Do not use plastic toys from your little brother's toy box!
- 4) A shoebox diorama/model depicting a scene of your choice from the novel. Include specific

- details. Must include a ½ page typed explanation of the scene depicted and its significance.
- 5) A poster collage for a character of your choice from the novel with a one-page typed explanation of the collage's and characters significance. Page must be completely filled with words, images, and/or tactile objects (cloth, straw, etc.).
- 6) A picture book review of the novel, containing 7 pages of pictures and a cover page. Each picture should have a two-sentence caption. The pictures should all have color and be hand-drawn.
