

Advanced Drawing and Painting

CHS's art program is designed to develop an understanding and appreciation of the artistic world. We seek to give students a feeling of personal satisfaction through the creative process and help them develop individual skills in the various areas of art. In all art courses, students develop a portfolio of work which they retain and present as their final. Because art studios use materials and tools that could be dangerous, safe, and cooperative behavior by students is absolutely necessary. The studio course instructor will be the ultimate judge of cooperation as well as safe and unsafe behavior. Individuals engaging in uncooperative and/or unsafe behavior will be cautioned and instructed once by the instructor. If a second occasion of uncooperative and/or unsafe behavior occurs, that student will be un- enrolled from the course.

Course Length: One semester

Prerequisite: Successful completion of Draw/Paint 1

Fee: \$25 may be charged through the School Treasurer-Paid through Revtrak

Enduring Understandings for Students:

Artists will create derived meaning and respond to works of art, objects in nature, and the environment.

Principles of design are used to effectively organize the elements of art in a work of art.

Students will learn technical practice, along with safe and appropriate use of materials, tools, processes, and technology, resulting in strong artistic skills and craftsmanship.

Art is created & understood through personal, social, historical, & cultural perspectives.

Critical analysis & aesthetic inquiry help understand & distinguish similarities & differences among works of art.

Grading

Students will be given adequate class time to complete all major assignments, but there will be times when students require additional time to complete major assignments. They will be expected to complete this work at home or during tutor time with a deadline established between the teacher and each individual student.

Missing/Late Homework Policy:

Each student has one "grace" day a semester, if for some reason the homework is missing or incomplete the student can use their grace day and turn it in the next class period.

Once the grace day is used up late homework must be turned in within 3 days of the original deadline and will drop no more than one letter grade. Teacher discretion will be used for work not submitted within the 3 day window. Missing work will earn a zero.

Summative work: Missing work in this category will result in no credit. Students who receive an NG and will need to retake the class in order to move on to the next level.

Drawing and painting studio projects in a wide variety of media, techniques and art forms.

Written and oral critiques of self and other works of art.

- Basic understanding and knowledge of artists, art forms and time periods through lecture, media presentations and artist experiences.
- Advanced understanding of composition and the utilization of the elements of art and the principals of design.
- Expand use of a sketchbook/journal with preliminary and finished drawings
- Basic skills tests and reflective assessments on knowledge covered during course both formative and summative ways.

Art History:

Students will continue an overview of Art History for all genres of art.

Students will research drawing and painting artists and movements. Sources could include slideshow/lecture, visiting artist, visual information in classroom (posters/books) internet options (you-tube, museum virtual tours) and movies. Students will be asked to reflect on this knowledge (ie; notes in a sketchbook, creation of artwork, written review, etc.). Students will effectively articulate artistic, historical and cultural influences in their works of art.

Literacy:

Students will be asked to write a critique about art with informed judgments about the relative merits of works of art. Students will be able to articulate their use of media, tools and techniques to express their visual voice in their works of art.

21st Century graduates:

While students gain confidence in their critical thinking and knowledge of art, they will build an advanced foundation of both drawing and painting experiences in established and new media. They will become further self-directed in communicating their ideas through self-direction and invention in works of art. Through a variety of resources such as: a Visiting Artists workshop, field trips, history lessons and research, students gain an understanding of how to accesses information efficiently and effectively for clarity how and why art is created. Finally, students will research careers in art.

Miscellaneous:

Clean up:

Students MUST CLEAN UP their materials and their work space at the end of each class period. Students mistreating or showing disregard for materials will be asked to replace them.

<u>Cell Phones, earbuds, iPods, and electronic devices:</u> must be turned off when the student enters the classroom – If a student is seen wearing headphones during a lecture, they will lose 10 points off of their final grade.

Studio Time: At various times throughout the semester, students will have studio time.

Sometimes this means time to leave the classroom to take research or work. Parents should be aware that during studio time, students may not be supervised by a teacher. Students are required to return to class at the end of studio time to check in with the teacher.

Artwork content: All artwork is subject to administer approval and BVSD policy. Students must use school appropriate language, imagery, and resources in the creation of their art work (no nudity, no violence, and vulgarity).

Grading:

Grading is based on a student's personal growth as well as an accumulation of project and participation-based points. Grading is based on an accumulation of summative and formative assignments.

To receive a passing grade the student must:

- Turn in all work complete and on time (name and date must appear clearly on all assignments).
- · Come to class on time and prepared.
- · Stay on task during class time.
- Use appropriate, responsible, respectful, and safe behavior: students will be given one warning if behavior is inappropriate. If it continues, the student will be dismissed from class. Parents will receive a phone or e-mail message from the teacher. The student will be marked unexcused absent for the day.





Behavior:
