# **FL Voting Guide**

• Early voting has ENDED in Florida. Make a plan to vote on Election Day!

### **Election Day Voting**

- Election Day is Tuesday, November 8, 2022.
- Polls are open 7:00am 7:00pm
- As long as you are in line by 7:00pm, you can vote. Stay in line!
- Everyone has a specific polling place they should go to based on their address. You can find your (or a friend's) polling place here: <a href="MillVote.com">IWIIIVote.com</a>
  - You can also find this information by visiting your county's Supervisor of Elections website!
- You **do** need to bring an ID (with a signature) with you to vote. Any one of the following photo IDs are accepted:
  - o Florida driver's license
  - Florida identification card issued by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles
  - United States passport
  - Debit or credit card
  - Military ID
  - Student ID
  - o Retirement center ID
  - Neighborhood association ID
  - Public assistance ID
  - Veteran health ID card issued by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs

- License to carry a concealed weapon or firearm issued pursuant to s.
  790.06
- Employee identification card issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the Federal Government, the state, a county, or a municipality

### **Voting by Mail**

- Florida voters have the option to vote by mail. This means that Florida will send you a ballot, you fill it out, and then you either mail it back or drop it off at a voting site (typically your county's Supervisor of Elections office).
- The deadline to request a mail ballot has passed, so folks should **plan to vote** on Election Day.
- Ballots must be received (not postmarked, but actually received!) by the Supervisor of Elections' office no later than 7:00pm on Election Day, November 8. So make sure to send ballots back ASAP!
- Ballots can no longer be sent back in through the mail, or dropped off at your county Supervisors of Elections office.
- Voters with mail-in ballots can also still vote in-person. They should bring their ballots (filled out or not filled out!) to their voting location. The poll workers will then take the mail-in ballot and give them a regular ballot to vote.
- Voters can track their mail-in ballots here.

# **FAQS**

### I'm voting by mail. How do I fill out my ballot?

- 1. Complete your entire ballot. Place your ballot into the secrecy envelope and then seal it in the larger mailing envelope.
- 2. **Sign the envelope.** Your vote will not count if you do not sign the envelope.
- Mail your ballot, or return it in person. If you're mailing your ballot, be sure to put postage on the envelope. To find an official drop-off location near you, click here.

### Where and when do I return my ballot?

You can either mail it back, or you can return it in person to your county Supervisor of Elections office. You can find your closest drop-off location here: <a href="MillVote.com">IWIIIVote.com</a>

Your ballot must be received by the county election office by 7:00pm on Election Day, so return it ASAP! Postmarks do not count.

Note: The mail can be slow, so your best bet is to return your ballot in person!

#### I requested a ballot but I want to vote in person instead.

That's okay – you can still vote in person! Bring your ballot with you to your polling place and give it to the poll workers. They will take your mail ballot, mark that you are voting in person instead, and give you a new ballot to fill out right there.

## I requested a ballot but I never received it // I received my ballot but lost it.

Go to your polling place on Election Day and let the poll workers know that you don't have your mail ballot. They will confirm that your ballot has not already been returned and received. Once they confirm that, you will be allowed to vote with a regular ballot. (If there's any confusion, don't worry – you can still vote with a provisional ballot!)
