The key with html is to set up the <u>structure</u> of your website with everything <u>properly</u> <u>named</u> so it can be easily enhanced with CSS. Remember if you have an element inside another (like list items inside an unordered list) that you <u>properly indent</u>. See how the start and end of the body, nav, ul, and html tags are in the same column; that is not an accident!
