Video Challenge: Record a short video of yourself speaking in Arabic about your classroom and the objects you have drawn.	This Week: Students explored classroom vocabulary through listening, speaking, and interactive activities. They practised identifying familiar objects and using simple sentence structures to communicate in Arabic. Next Week: Students will learn how to use demonstratives (هَذَا / هَذِهِ – this) and descriptive adjectives such as big, small, long, and short. 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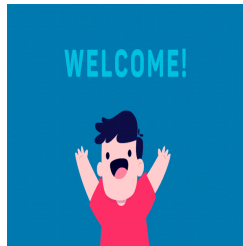
