CLASSROOM EXPECTATIONS

- We are a TEAM!
- Maintain a good and respectful attitude.
- You may use the restroom/drink water during the first 15 minutes. Using the restroom any other time costs 5
 ClassDojo points off your participation grade or your class ticket for the 9 weeks.
- Being on time means being in your seat with all materials when the bell rings.
- Follow directions the first time they are given.
- Respect the teacher by not talking without permission. Questions concerning the music and our lessons are great; just be sure to raise your hand and be called upon before you speak.
- No food, drinks, or GUM will be allowed in the choir room. Water in a closed container is allowed and encouraged.
- Please keep your hands to yourself while rehearsing; this includes not grooming another student's hair, etc.
- Cell phones are not allowed out during class unless given explicit permission from Mrs. Kennell. If your cell phone is out, it will be placed in "Cell Phone Jail" and can be bailed out at the **end of the period.**
- Students who are ill or otherwise unable to participate in singing must have a written note and are expected to remain focused on the music during class.
- Choir students are expected to be model citizens in and out of the choir room.
- Proper concert etiquette will be observed at all performances.

GRADING

Choir is a performance-based class; therefore, performances are considered major test grades. *All dress rehearsals and concerts are major test grades!* Students will also be graded on warm-ups, singing tests, written tests, projects, and sectionals.

Weekly grade will be figured as follows:

NORMAL UNIFORM:

The Lamar Choir's informal uniform for ALL members will consist of **jeans** (regular <u>blue</u> pants or jeans purchased on your own), and the purple Lamar Choir shirt (purchased through the school). Please adhere to the AISD dress code with regard to the jeans and be sure they are not torn/ripped or excessively faded.

Students will not be allowed to perform if concert apparel is not correct & will receive a 50 for their concert grade

FEES

There is a required \$50 student fee for all choir classes that helps fund choir operating expenses such as sheet music, fees for competitions, expensive equipment, field trips (buses, substitutes, student meals, entertainment), accompanists, incentives, awards, & supplies for choir class. Choir students must also pay \$20 for a choir t-shirt, as well as any uniform fees, unless choir students already own those items. Guardians must talk to Mrs. Kennell if special payment arrangements are needed to help cover the cost of fees. Students will not receive their choir t-shirt or uniform until all fees are paid or payment arrangements have been made with Mrs. Kennell.

- **Donations are accepted at all times throughout the school year.
- **7th & 8th graders who will be auditioning for All-Region Choir will need to pay the \$12 entry fee. This fee includes your sheet music (not photocopies).

FUNDRAISING

Lamar Choirs have two major fund-raisers a year, the Musical, in addition to our Fancloth and World's Finest Chocolates. Money raised will help pay for music, uniforms and other instructional materials. Any remaining funds will go toward other choir expenses that develop during the year. Donations are also welcomed and accepted at any time during the school year. The LMS Choir Booster Club will also have various fundraisers throughout the year on a strictly optional basis.

SECTIONALS

Scottie Singers and Doggie Dames will be asked to attend morning sectionals from 7:45-8:10 once every other week based on voice part. Makeup sectionals will be on Thursday mornings from 7:45-8:10. Other choirs will be asked to attend after school sectionals on an as-needed basis. These rehearsals will be posted on the choir website (www.lamarchoir.com/sectionals) to provide ample planning time.

SOCIAL EVENT & TRIP GUIDELINES

The choir will provide several opportunities for students to socialize & travel during the school year. These opportunities may include the AISD Honor Choir Festival, TMEA Region 18 MS Choir Contest/Clinic/Concert, UIL Choir Contest, and the Spring choir trip.

In order to be eligible for these events & trips, students must...

- 1. have all choir forms & fees turned in
- 2. pass all classes the previous 9 weeks (or have no failing progress reports the following 9 weeks if they failed the previous 9 weeks)
- 3. attend all required choir concerts & performances the previous 9 weeks
- 4. have appropriate behavior in choir in the previous 9 weeks
- 5. NOT receive ANY referrals the previous nine weeks.
- 6. participate in the UIL Choir Contest, if their class competes.

When attending an event or trip, students should...

- 1. wear the required uniform or attire for that day.
- 2. bring any snacks, music, money, or other materials that are specifically needed for that event or trip.
- 3. follow bus rules by remaining seated, refraining from loud conversations or loud singing, & never allowing any object to go beyond the bus windows.
- 4. not talk to strangers, tell them who they are, who they are with, or leave with them for any reason.
- 5. be respectful to chaperones and follow directions.
- 6. not draw unnecessary attention to the group by exhibiting behaviors such as shoplifting, aggressive behavior, loud conversations, profanity, fighting, inappropriate relations, drugs, etc...
- 7. never display inappropriate affection.
- 8. provide their own meal or snacks if they have special dietary needs in the event a meal is provided by the choir.
- 9. never leave the group without Mrs. Kennell's consent.
- 10. be checked out through the front office before leaving with a guardian if the event or trip is during the school day.
- 11. leave the buses clean before getting off of them.
- 12. make arrangements with their other teachers to make up any work they may have missed during the school day while attending an event or trip.

SACRED MUSIC

"It is the position of MENC: The National Association for Music Education that the study and performance of religious music within an educational context is a vital and appropriate part of a comprehensive music education. The omission of sacred music from the school curriculum would result in an incomplete educational experience."

Students in choir WILL encounter music with religious texts of any culture, however there will be no effort whatsoever on the part of the director to influence or proselytize towards any religious belief or ideal. Please find an excerpt below from the AISD policy on religious music:

"The study of religion as it relates to history, culture, literature, music, drama, and art is an appropriate element of school curriculum. Such programs can be <u>a</u> <u>valuable tool for teaching values of tolerance and cultural understanding.</u> The public school curriculum, including the study of religion, should be presented objectively and neutrally as part of a secular program of education"
