EVENT SUMMARY

Session Overview

On November 4 and 10, 2022, the Telescope Network hosted a Learning Site at the Henry Grew Elementary school in Hyde Park on the topic "How do we support all learners to engage in complex texts?" Our host teacher was Emmanuel Fairley-Pittman (Grade 5 @ Grew) and debrief facilitator was Natasha Gordon (ESL/Librarian @ Grew). We had 23 participants join from 14 different BPS schools/departments join this session.





What is a Learning Site?

In a Learning Site, educators come together for a 1/2 day in a real live classroom around a common area of practice. Participants debrief with the host teacher and set goals for their own classrooms. Participants continue the learning through virtual follow-up sessions to earn an ALC credit.

Why this topic?

This session topic was identified as part of the Telescope Network Spring 2022 needs assessment. One of the major themes in the survey data was equitable literacy instruction and working with complex texts. Sample educator responses:

- How can we ensure that students are exposed to complex text without overwhelming and frustrating themhow do we get the balance right?
- How do we differentiate for the different literacy skill levels of students in our classroom especially if they are traditionally with a SEI or Sub-separate classroom education history?

Participant Takeaways

We asked, "What's one thing you learned today that might benefit your students?" Sample responses:

- Metacognition + UDL + Share excitement = student success
- Process over product-- students should see the value of the "how" not just the "what"
- I quote (a student): "This is fun!" Literacy should be fun and...students owning the learning.
- I am thinking about the way the students worked collaboratively in small groups.
- Sharing the "heavy lifting" Setting up clear and solid expectations. Seeing student take ownership for their own learning and growth.
- The teacher holding high the expectations---while scaffolding for various needs, yet demonstrating that all students can and will be able to read and understand the text.
