1. a) Why is man considered the climax of God's creation?

(7 marks)

- o He was created in God's image/likeness.
- o He has God's breath.
- o He was created to have fellowship with God/communicate with Him.
- o He was given free will/conscience/knowledge/intelligence/between right and wrong.
- o He was given the responsibility to rule over/dominion/manages all the creation of God.
- o Man was blessed and commanded to go and multiply/fill the earth.
- o Man was given responsibility to name the rest of the animals/creation.
- o Man was created last after everything else had been created for his use.
- o Before the creation there was consultation in heaven "let us make....man in our image
- oafter our likeness".
- o Man was given a helper/companion mate
- o Man was moulded by God himself.

b) Outline the differences between the Biblical view of sin and the African concept of evil.

- o Biblically the sinner faces consequences as an individual or a nation while in Traditional
- o society evil brings suffering to the person, family and entire community.
- o Traditionally suffering is a consequence of sin but biblically it could be a symbol from God.
- o Traditionally, evil has no solution in eternal life but biblically there is salvation through Jesus Christ.

c) Ways in which the teaching of C.R.E. promotes international consciousness. (6 marks)

- o Helps one to appreciate all men as God's creation/one human race
- o Helps one to appreciate that God created all men with a purpose/irrespective of their background.
- o Helps one to appreciate responsibility for others/love one's neighbours
- o Enables learners to understand/respect/appreciate other people's faith
- o Helps one to appreciate the universality of God (Amos pronounced judgement to all)
- o Helps one to appreciate sharing/helping others in times of need like apostles in times of the early church.

2. a Describe the call of the first disciples

- Jesus chose His disciples from among the many followers who came to listen to His teachings.
- Jesus called the first men to be His disciples while off the shores of the Lake of Gennesaret.
- Jesus saw two boats out the waters edge where the fishermen were washing their nets.
- Jesus entered into the boat of Simon and taught the crowd from the crowd from there.
- After he had finished teaching, He asked Simon to cast his nets into the sea to catch fish.
- Simon was moved by the miraculous catch.
- He fell at Jesus feet and confessed his sinfulness.
- Jesus assured Simon not to be afraid because he now had a new role.
- This meant he had been called to be a disciple of Jesus. (7x1=7marks)

b Duties and privileges of Jesus' disciples.

- A disciple has the duty to be totally committed and dedicated to Jesus.

- A disciple has to sacrifice even one's family for the sake of Christ.
- A disciple should be ready to live in self-denial and suffering.
- A disciple has the duty to spread the gospel and let others know Jesus.
- A Disciple is privileged to be a member of God's kingdom. (4x2 = 8 marks)

c Lessons a Christian learn from the call of the first disciples.

- o God is not a respecter of persons and can choose anybody to serve Him.
- o God demands obedience from those He calls.
- o God can reveal Himself to people in their everyday activity as He did with the disciples.
- o God works with the humble.
- o Christians learn that being called may mean forsaking their occupations and families for the sake of the kingdom.
- o Christians should be ready to confess their sins as Simon did.

3. (a) Explain the problems that Moses faced as he led the Israelites (8mks)

- The Israelites turned against him and panicked when they saw the Egyptians following them.
- Lack of food/hunger in the wilderness
- He had problems in organizing and uniting the Israelites
- They encountered hostile/unfriendly tribes in the wilderness
- Lack of water
- Sometimes people lost confidence in Moses and grumble against him
- The Israelites worshipped the golden calf while Moses was away
- Fatigue / tiredness
- Harsh desert conditions i.e hot during the day and very cold at night
- Wild animals posed a danger e.g snakes
- Disputes arose and he had to settle them among the people
- Israelites feared the might of the Canaanites (4x1=4mks)

(b) What conditions did God expect the Israelites to fulfill; with the renewal of the covenant (7mks)

- To obey what God commands them
- Not to make any treaty with those who live in the land where they were going
- To breakdown the altars, sacred stones and false gods of the inhabitants of Canaan
- Not to make cast idols
- To keep the feast of the unleavened bread
- To rest on the seventh day / Sabbath
- To dedicate their entire first born male children and first born male of their domestic animals
- To offer to God the first fruits of their crops (7x1=7mks)

4. (a) Outline seven prophecies made by Prophet Nathan concerning the messiah. (7 mks)

- o The Messiah will be a descendant of David
- o During his reign people will be safe from their enemies / they shall dwell in peace.
- o The Messiah will be supported by God.
- o During his reign, God will give his people land to dwell in.
- o The Messiah will have an everlasting kingdom.
- o The Messiah will be the son of God.
- o God will keep the Messiah's kingdom strong.

(b) Describe the events that led to the singing of the Benedictus. (7 mks)

- o Elizabeth gave birth to a son.
- o There was happiness and celebration.
- o On the eighth day, the boy was circumcised in accordance to the Jewish traditions.
- o During the naming, Elizabeth named the boy John.
- o The people were shocked at the choice of the name because it was not customary. It was not a family name.
- o Zachariah who was dumb gave the same name in writing which surprised many people.
- o Zachariah regained speech and the people marveled.
- o Zachariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and praised God through the song Benedictus.

- o They have a duty to prepare others for God's kingdom.
- o They should lead righteous lives to escape God's judgement and punishment.
