#### Course Description

Foundations of Fashion Design introduces students to the rich history of the fashion industry and the basic design principles that are integral to its operation. Upon completion of this course, proficient students will be able to demonstrate basic garment production and will create artifacts for inclusion in a portfolio, which will continue to build throughout the program of study.
