### Effective tracking and monitoring of Support

- A support meeting should be arranged with parent/carers and SFL/class teacher to discuss agreed future planning and actions.
- Not all learners with dyslexia will require an IEP as significant adaptations often do not have to be made to meet their needs. IEPs are usually provided when the curriculum planning is required to be 'significantly' different from the class curriculum. Involvement with group work or extraction for a number of sessions a week does not normally meet the criteria for an IEP. (Dyslexia Scotland)
