

# GOAT Community Stewardship Subcommittee Standard Operating Procedures

## Summary

Community stewardship subcommittees are the gears of GOAT. Each subcommittee facilitates the continual progress of one aspect of GOAT. Building on the [GOAT 2024 Proposal](#), the [community-identified](#) subcommittees are as follows:

- Governance
- Community Calls
- Conference booth
- Virtual events
- Community mapping
- Communications (websites/ slack/ etc)
- Fundraising
- Finance / Accounting
- In-person events (Conference)
- Technical Infrastructure

**Committee structure:** Every subcommittee should have an appointed lead, and most committees will require a small team (i.e., are multi-member committees).

### **GOAT 2024:**

There will be a GOAT 2024 salon about GOAT community stewardship. Each subcommittee will debut at the conference in a 3 minute lightning talk. Then recruitment.

**Semi-Annual Community Stewardship Workshops:** Sub committees shall convene at GOAT Community Stewardship workshops, which occur before or at the start of each year (i.e., Dec/Jan), and meet again once more mid-year (i.e., June/July) to discuss administrative logistics of GOAT as it pertains to their committees. These workshops should take about ½ day, and committee leads or a different representative are required to attend.

**Community Calls:** Each sub committee will be asked to provide a 2-minute or one-slide report to the community at each quarterly community call.

**Scoping:** Each subcommittee will need to fill out an **Annual Committee Scoping Form** at the start of each year, to be distributed at the first stewardship meeting of the year.

**Profiles on GOAT website:** helps put a face to GOAT. Incentive + self documentation of GOAT.

**Outreach:** Each committee is responsible for their own outreach.

**Documentation:** Each committee is responsible for their own documentation on the website, on forums, etc.

**Newsletter:** Summary of community call + other stuff.

**Incentive to participate:** Consider conference registration, stipends, and recognition on the website as incentive to participate.

## Committees Overview

Template:

- Define expectations and scope:
  - Include the goal
  - Who it serves:
  - How extensive the work is:
- Determine duration of lead "chair" position (term)
  - E.g., 1 year minimum, maximum 2 years (then move to a different position)
  - Should have attended at least one event or involved online for a year before taking a lead position
  - Financial and fundraising positions are 2 year minimum, with 3 year max
- Meeting frequency of subcommittee
  - A little dependent on the committee, should be defined.

Logistics:

- How subcommittees communicate to each other
  - Beginning of year for kick off
  - Midyear for status
- How they communicate to the broader community

- Each sub committee gets 3 minutes at a community call
- What are incentives?
  - Free admission to a conference?
  - Optional Stipends? E.g., \$500 a year
