Course Outcomes

This course is based on the 8th Grade California State Content Standards for History.

Students will:

- Analyze historical texts to evaluate key figures, concepts, and events that impacted the growth
 and development of the United States from its colonization through the events leading to
 independence and establishment of the Republic.
- Explore the United States' involvement in foreign affairs and international conflicts, Westward
 expansion and Manifest Destiny, the Civil War, Reconstruction, and the Industrial and
 Progressive Eras.
- Explain the key events and analyze the cultural, political, economic, and geographic impact they made on the people of this nation.
- Make connections between what they learn in the classroom, their own lives, and local and global communities.
- Participate in whole group and small group inquiry-based discussions and activities, collaborate with peers, and research and prepare projects and presentations that challenge and engage them.
