## Not in Our Name!

# 350+ Jewish Socialists Say No to Apartheid and Genocide Sign on here.

We, the undersigned Jewish socialists, are proud to support Palestine's struggle for freedom. We grieve over lives lost in Palestine and Israel and we remain firmly committed to the end of the Israeli occupation and apartheid. We seek an end to its degradation, displacement, dehumanization and genocide of Palestinians in Gaza, the West Bank, and inside Israel.

The Democratic Socialists of America (DSA)—the largest US-based socialist organization in one hundred years—despite having clearly and wholeheartedly condemned the murder of thousands of civilians in the last week, was viciously attacked over its antiwar and anti-colonial politics. Amidst a bipartisan and corporate media consensus to fall behind Israel and decimate Gaza, news outlets and politicians have been opportunistically attacking DSA and all other socialists' support for Palestine. A Republican congressman even introduced a resolution in the House of Representatives to condemn DSA's New York City Chapter.

These same commentators provide near-endless support for Israel's subjection and mass murder of Palestinians. The outrage against DSA is clearly not rooted in preventing the killing of civilians and working toward a lasting peace. Socialists are being attacked for recognizing that the tragic attacks on civilians by Hamas are the result of a vicious cycle of violence imposed by the Israeli military occupation and apartheid, and that the only way to protect all Israelis and Palestinians is through ending this occupation and delivering Palestinians real liberation.

We call on all our Jewish family to stand up and oppose the genocide of Palestinians. <u>Call your representatives</u> to demand an end to US support for the bloodshed, attend a <u>local action</u>, and take part in the Jews Against Genocide <u>days of action</u> in Washington, DC.

Make no mistake: opposing Israeli apartheid and the impending genocide in Gaza are just, right, and not antisemitic. We are proud to be Jewish, socialist, and pro-Palestine. As Israel carries out the same crimes once committed against our ancestors, we declare not in our name!

Israel is Carrying Out a Genocide

The past 75 years have been marked by the systematic expulsion of Palestinians from their land and subjection to second-class citizenry. The state of Israel was founded through the violent ethnic cleansing of over 700,000 Palestinians, the murder of tens of thousands, and the destruction of hundreds of towns.

In the past two decades, the Israeli occupation has taken thousands of lives, <u>95 percent of them</u> Palestinians. Palestinians in Gaza notoriously live in the world's largest open-air prison, suffering from generations of an Israeli blockade that denies them access to basic necessities and the freedom of movement.

The occupation is characterized by continuous surveillance and security checkpoints, harassment by the Israeli Defense Forces (IDF), routine airstrikes, summary executions of civilians, children, journalists, and medical workers, and evictions and pogroms by Israeli settlers with the support of the Israeli government and military. Palestinians live as starved and brutalized prisoners on their own land.

The Netanyahu government is the furthest right in Israel's history, including self-identified fascists, theocrats, and Jewish supremacists. It has unleashed a campaign of terror on Palestinians in the West Bank in order to claim the land for Israel. This colonization effort is led by Finance Minister Bezalel Smotrich, a self-identified fascist who has called for wiping out parts of Palestine and has <u>claimed there</u> is "no such thing as a <u>Palestinian people,"</u> Right-wing governments and politicians from Trump in the US to Meloni in Italy <u>look to Israel as a model.</u> White supremacists like the neo-Nazi Richard Spencer <u>praise Israel</u> as an example par excellence for his desired white ethno-state.

Despite its ferocious rhetoric against Hamas, the Israeli government played a <u>deliberate role in nurturing the group</u> in its early days to challenge secular nationalist, and left-wing parties and to divide and conquer the Palestinian movement. The far-right militaristic populism of the Israeli government feeds off of the fear of Hamas to maintain their power and justify their worst impulses. And those worst impulses only serve to encourage violent retribution as Palestinians lose more and more family, and lose more and more hope for liberation through peaceful means.

In the days since the Hamas-led attack, the Israeli government and top officials have openly declared their intentions to commit war crimes and have spoken of massacring and expelling Palestinians throughout Israel, Gaza, and the West Bank as a collective punishment. Like the Iraq War of 2003, a tragedy is being used to gin up support for a terrible war. Netanyahu has <u>promised</u> to turn Gaza to rubble, while Israeli President Isaac Herzog has <u>blamed</u> all Gazans for the attack, claiming that there are no civilians in Gaza. Gaza is home to 2.2 million Palestinians, half of whom are children and for whom

the median age is 18. In the West Bank, the Israeli military is currently <u>arming settlers</u> to carry out vicious attacks on Palestinians.

Israel's war on Gaza has deliberately targeted innocents and civilian infrastructure in an effort to cause as much destruction as possible. Israel has ordered the evacuation of over one million Palestinians from northern Gaza and has instructed which roads to use for safe passage. Those same roads are then bombed as civilians try to escape. The Israeli government has threatened to bomb aid shipments to Gaza, has cut off energy to hospitals, is deploying White Phosphorus, an illegal chemical weapon, and gleefully posts photos of entire residential blocks in Gaza leveled by its airstrikes. Government leaders speak of a second Nakba – a final solution for Palestinians.

When we see an Israeli general <u>describe Palestinians</u> as "human animals" we can't help but see the images of Nazi propaganda that portrayed our grandparents and great grandparents as rats and cockroaches, vermin to be exterminated. Similar genocidal rhetoric can be heard from US politicians as they rattle their sabers for war. Senator Marco Rubio has talked about the need to "eradicate" Hamas, while former UN ambassador <u>Nikki Haley stated</u>, "[t]his is sick, and we have to treat sick people the way they deserve to be treated and eliminate them."

The far right of the US is joined by supposedly conservative, moderate, and liberal politicians from all corners. President Biden and Congress are getting ready to flood Israel with billions more in military aid, to fund this ethnic cleansing. Far-right European leaders are standing behind Netanyahu, France is banning pro-Palestine rallies, the US is backing Israel no strings attached, and genocide of Palestinians in Gaza is around the corner.

#### What Real Safety for the Jewish People Means

As Jews, we live with the memory of the Holocaust, along with centuries of pogroms, displacements, and inquisition. Over the past few years, in the US and around the world, there has been a rise in antisemitic right-wing parties and groups. Israel does not make us safe.

The Netanyahu government collaborates with Hungary's far-right Viktor Orbán, a virulent anti-semite. In Germany, pro-Palestine Jews are targeted by government censors and brutalized by the police in the name of "fighting anti-semitism," while the neo-Nazi Alternative Für Deutschland (AfD) continues to gain support with next to no response from these same figures. These forces don't care about fighting antisemitism and making the world a safe place for Jews, just about protecting and absolving Israel at all costs.

Jews who oppose apartheid and the occupation are quickly dismissed as self-hating. But we also feel anxiety and fear for ourselves and our loved ones, and we are committed to defending each other just as we are committed to standing up for all peoples. Locking up millions of Palestinians, killing their children with impunity, and claiming to do so in the name of the Jewish people endangers Jews everywhere. Zionists who insist on the inseparability of Israeli apartheid and Judaism have innocent Jewish blood on their hands.

#### Tikkun Olam — We Need Socialist Organization

Many Jews hold dear the rabbinical concept of *tikkun olam*, meaning "to repair the world," and see it as a call to social justice. We cherish rich traditions of not only resisting antisemitism but standing up against oppression of all peoples everywhere. As socialists, we know that capitalism is the axle upon which other forms of oppression revolve in our world today. Both modern antisemitism, and the continued oppression of Palestinians are rooted in this capitalist system.

For generations, Jews have served as a convenient scapegoat for capitalism's brutal class inequalities and endemic crises and insecurity. At the same time, Israel is the world's second highest spender on military per capita. The US sends billions in military aid to Israel, enriching the Israeli war industry which sells equipment to right-wing governments in India, Azerbaijan, the Philippines, and even back to the US. US war companies like Raytheon and Lockheed Martin rely on lucrative contracts with Israel, funded by US taxpayers who suffer expensive healthcare, crumbling infrastructure, and dilapidated public schools. As corporate Democrats and Republicans deny working people the basics of a social safety net, we forfeit billions upon billions to fund bloodshed the world over.

As Jewish Americans, as socialists, as working people, we say: not in our name! The weaponization of antisemitism to justify atrocities against the Palestinian people, and the identification of Judaism with the Israeli state and its apartheid regime—these are unconscionable crimes and risk the lives of innocent Jews everywhere.

We follow the <u>Boycott</u>, <u>Divestment</u>, <u>Sanctions (BDS) Movement's demands</u> for an immediate ceasefire, allowing through humanitarian aid, and providing UN protection for Palestinians in Gaza. We oppose any and all bills to send money and weapons to Israel. Challenging Israeli apartheid and its military occupation of Palestine means building a mass movement of working people to challenge capitalists and their politicians here at home. That's why we stand proud as Jewish socialists in solidarity with the Palestinian struggle for liberation.

As Jewish people we're taught the phrase "Never Again" from a young age. To not stand up now for justice in Palestine would make those words hollow. We must act. If not now, when? May our ancestors forgive us for the crimes committed in their names.

We once again reiterate our call to action. <u>Take to the streets</u>, <u>call your representatives</u>, attend the <u>national days of action</u> for Jews Against Genocide in Washington DC, and join us in our call to end the decades of Israeli apartheid and military occupation.
