What is the purpose of this award?

The award was established to recognize individuals who have **served as FGG Delegates or Board Members**, and whose contributions the FGG wishes to honour.

How often and to whom is this award given?

Any number of men or women, at any time. Normally at the FGG Annual Meeting.

What are the qualifications for a nominee?

A nominee should:

- be a former board member who has shown exceptional service to the FGG during his or her tenure
- have gone beyond the normal tasks and duties of a member of the FGG Board of Directors.

A nominee may also be a long-time delegate or volunteer who has never served on the Board but who has offered distinguished service.

Who is eligible for this award?

- A former FGG board member
- Exceptionally, a former Delegate or Volunteer
- FGG staff is not eligible.
- If there are sufficient grounds to suspect that a potential nominee has recruited nominations for the award, that nominee will not be considered as a candidate.
- The Federation of Gay Games reserves the right to use the nominee's name and achievement record in news stories and feature articles at a later date, whether or not the nominee is selected as an Honorary Life Member.
- This award may be awarded posthumously.

Nomination for Honorary Life Membership: Joanie Evans

Joanie Evans has been a driving force within the Federation of Gay Games (FGG) and the broader LGBTQ+ sports community for over two decades, demonstrating an unwavering commitment to the principles of Participation, Inclusion, and Personal Best™. Her journey began in the late 1990s as an Observer for Team UK and Great Britain at the 1998 Seattle and 1999 Berlin Annual General Assemblies (AGA), laying the foundation for a career dedicated to service.

Joanie quickly escalated her involvement, serving on the crucial **Sports** and **Membership Committees** starting in **1999** and **2000** respectively. This early engagement established a deep understanding of the FGG's organizational structure and the needs of the community, proving vital for her later leadership roles.

A watershed moment in Joanie's FGG journey was at the **2006 Lyon AGA**, where she was elected **Female VP for Diversity**. This election marked the beginning of a decade of high-level service, focused on ensuring the FGG authentically represented the global diversity of the LGBTQ+ community. She continued to serve as the **Board Member – Female VP Diversity** at the **2007 San Francisco AGA**.

This dedication to governance expanded as she became an elected **Female Co-President** of the FGG, first serving from **2013-2015** and then for a second term from **2015-2017**. In this top leadership capacity, Joanie played a pivotal role in shaping the direction of the Federation, advocating for greater inclusion, and ensuring the continued success and expansion of the Gay Games movement.

Crucially, during her presidency, Joanie was a key **Member of the 1WE Working Group** (One World Event). This body was tasked with complex and often contentious negotiations with the Gay & Lesbian International Sport Association (GLISA) to explore merging the Gay Games and the Outgames into a single quadrennial event. Joanie's involvement in these discussions demonstrates her commitment to **community unity** and her ability to navigate high-stakes, sensitive inter-organizational matters at the forefront of the movement.

Joanie's influence extended beyond the FGG board and into partner organizations. She served as the **Elected Female Co-President of the IGLFA Board** (International Gay and Lesbian Football Association) from **2010 to 2012** during the time of **Gay Games 8 in Cologne**, demonstrating a powerful commitment to the operational success of specific sports within the Games.

Furthermore, she was a key member of the **Paris 2018 Steering Committee** across two FGG terms, ensuring the monumental success of the 10th Gay Games. She was also a part organizer of the **Brighton Women's Conference**, illustrating her dedication to specific community-building initiatives and the empowerment of women in sports.

Joanie Evans is an exceptionally deserving candidate for Honorary Life Membership. Her **unwavering**, **long-term commitment** to volunteerism, starting as an observer and culminating in two terms as **Female Co-President of the FGG**, is a testament to her dedication. She has not only served the Federation but has actively shaped its evolution—particularly in championing **diversity**, leading crucial **unification efforts**, and ensuring the operational success of the Gay Games. Her profound impact on the LGBTQ+ sports landscape, both locally and internationally, makes her a truly exemplary figure.
