4. Summarize and prepare transactions for assets, liabilities, investments, stockholder's equity components and reporting, comprehensive income reporting, income taxes, reporting pension funds, financial statement analysis, and accounting transaction error identification and correction.

**Course Requirements:**

**Quizzes:**

Grading will be based on quizzes and weekly assignments. The quizzes will be online and text-based, with open book and notes.

Because this is a rigorous and time

consuming course, you should make every effort to start right away and keep up with the schedule. All homework assignments are set for 2 attempts and your score will be the average of the two. I encourage you to practice doing these Brief Exercises located at the end of each chapter on your own before checking the answers.
