IN GENERAL, OUR COURSES ARE AVAILABLE TO STUDENTS BEGINNING THEIR SOPHOMORE (NOT COSMETOLOGY) YEAR. HOWEVER, IF A CLASS FILLS OR IS OVERLOADED, PREFERENCE IS GIVEN TO JUNIORS, SENIORS, AND POTENTIAL COMPLETERS.

NO STUDENTS IN A NINTH GRADE HOMEROOM CAN REGISTER FOR CLASSES AT F. E. DuBOSE CAREER CENTER.

Additional Health Science Information:

*Health Science I and II are taught as “one block but two classes, in one semester”, either fall or spring. Both courses are listed in PowerSchool, and students should be enrolled in both courses concurrently.

*Health Science III and Clinical Studies enrollment must be for the entire year even though they are separate classes. The student can only drop from the clinical studies class if he or she does not meet the grade requirement of 75 in order to move forward.

*As stated on course offerings, a strong background in math and science is recommended for students who want to enroll in this program. There is a minimum grade requirement to continue into upper levels of the program.

Additional Cosmetology Information:

*All students who enroll must be at least 16 years and a junior in high school. Sophomores can no longer enroll or begin the program early.

*Cos I and Cos II are taken back to back in the junior year (each semester) in the mornings; Cos III and Cos IV are taken back to back in the senior year (each semester) in the afternoons. They must take all four classes to be a completer and to be eligible for a SC License in Cosmetology. There is a minimum grade requirement to continue into upper levels of the program.
