it is a singular thing firm when it's found a hand reached out a word to the marrow hope is

fine grained like lavender gone to seed gossamer a moth's wings there's no wait called hope it's

a hand a whisper a moment shared nearly not there but like a shadow they're all the same

friday night my spouse kneel and i watched a couple of episodes of the umbrella academy

on netflix we were relaxed and doing those last things that you do before you get ready for bed

48:20

he fed the cat set up the dishwasher then headed upstairs to just check those final things on his

computer i fed the hedgehog saw that he was nearly out of water and went to the kitchen to refill

48:35

his little sippy bottle right when i got back to his cage and was putting his bottle back i heard

48:45

a yelled expletive from upstairs not the kind that i would hear if something had fallen and broken

48:55

not the kind that erupts with a sudden pain of a stubbed toe no a yell of anguish 49:06

my heart jumped into my throat and i began moving toward the stairs what what happened i yelled

49:14

i reached the bottom of the stairs and heard ginsburg is dead wait as in ruth bader ginsburg

neil affirmed that it was true notorious rbg had died my heart sank deep and my mind 49:38

began to race an icon a brilliant feminist who spent her life furthering the rights of 49:46

those who have been denied them the shining light of hope on the supreme court that 49:54

love and justice could still win the woman known for lifting weights well into her 80s 50:02

supreme court justice ruth bader ginsburg died on friday night those who are older 50:13

than i am tell the story of where they were when they heard that kennedy had been shot

50:21

those older still like my recently deceased father remember pearl harbor i can recount the morning

50:30

of september 11 2001. my heart feels that this new moment hearing profanity from upstairs while

50:42

standing at the hedgehog's enclosure will sit with me for the rest of my life as well yet another

50:54

thing that seemed immovable constant and without end has changed this year one after another

fear piled upon fear disaster upon disaster worry upon worry disappointment upon disappointment it's

51:11

heavy maybe you don't like being reminded of it but i name it still all of this is heavy 51:27

it builds up piece after peace weight after weight until moving is so very hard are you tired

i am that's okay it's to be expected we live in nothing but uncertainty right now 51:56

it is as though the ground upon which we have stood for so long

52:01

has fallen away leaving us hanging immobile and utterly incapable of doing much of anything

friday evening sunset was the beginning of rosh hashanah the jewish new year 52:24

it is a time of celebration to eat apples and honey

to ensure a sweet year ahead to blow the shofar and announce newness to the world 52:38

and that was the time that justice ginsburg left us jewish tradition calls a person who 52:49

dies at rosh hashanah etharik a person of great righteousness and truly as we remember her rbg

truly was she brought forth justice with her power of will

presence brilliance and strength all fit into her small frame

53:18

now when we mourn her and what she has represented to us for so many years when 53:26

many of us fall into fear and despair for what may happen now that she is gone we must also channel

her courage at the age of 87 she did her work as a supreme court justice from her hospital bed

53:47

to her last moment her passion lit a fire that could not be quelled and so even now let us rely

53:58

on one another's strengths joined together with the strength of those beyond our congregation

to continue this work of justice however we can that hope the nebulous thing that is like a shadow

there and not there at the same time must reside in our hearts and our souls and bring us to action
