- Roaring Twenties from Fitzgerald's perspective:
 - Decayed social and moral values
 - Cynicism, greed, empty pursuit of pleasure
 - Decadent parties, wild jazz
 - Corruption of the American Dream--Unrestrained desire for money and pleasure surpassed more noble goals.

• World War I--Lost Generation

- Young men returning from war disillusioned and cynical after brutality
- Social morality of Victorian America no longer acceptable

• Stock Market skyrocketing

- Anyone can make a fortune
- Clash between old money and nouveau riche

• Prohibition--18th Amendment

- Banned the sale of alcohol
- o Demand for bootleg liquor--rise of organized crime
