This week in History, on May 6, 1954, Roger Bannister (a 25-year old medical student) broke a huge barrier by completing the running of a mile in under 4 minutes. In years prior, athletes believed that it was a physically impossible feat. Before Bannister's first competitive race of 1954, he studied the mechanics of running and trained with his personally developed and researched scientific method. The day of his race, Roger Bannister broke the tape at 3 minutes and 59.4 seconds. His true passion was medicine, so he retired from competitive running and went on to become a neurologist. He was later knighted by Queen Elizabeth II for his successful medical career!

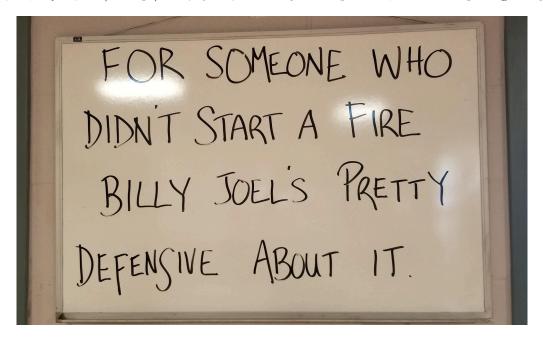

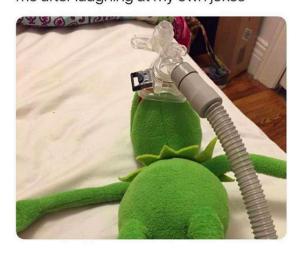

5. What does a typical Saturday/Sunday look like for you?

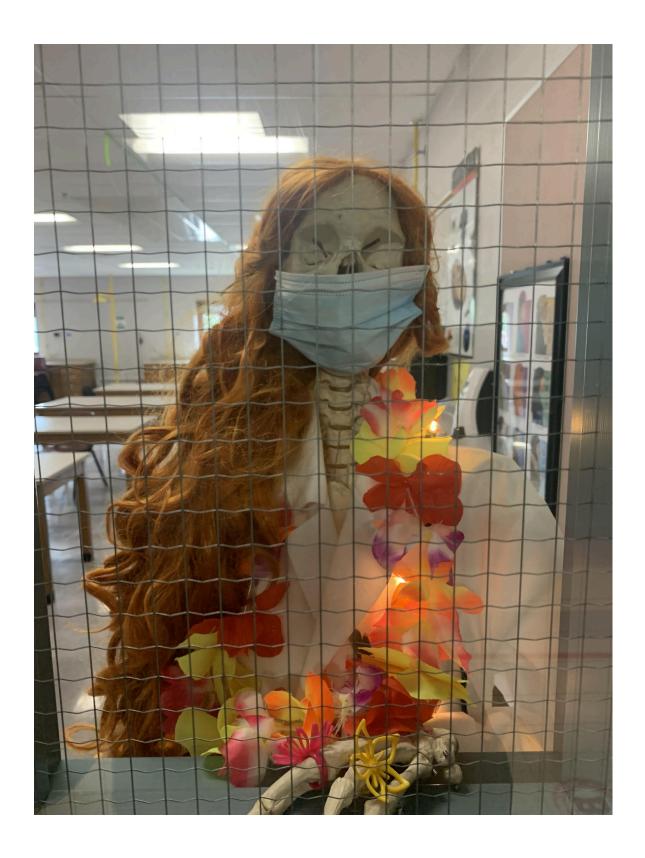

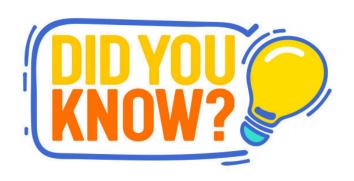
