School Characteristics:

West Charlotte High School is a community-based school that is part of the Charlotte Mecklenburg School System. West Charlotte was built in 1938 and is one of Charlotte's oldest public schools, that has a rich history of producing widely noted public officials, athletes, and business leaders. On April 2005, West Charlotte was authorized as an International Baccalaureate World School and has successfully offered courses under the IB Programme to those scholars that seek the academic rigor and cultural awareness of the International Programme. Scholars that do not seek the compendium of the IB Programme often take advantage of the robust multilevel course offerings, made available through direct instruction and the state online North Carolina Virtual Public School (NCVPS). Additionally, selected scholars may be invited to enroll in either AVID or the nine career pathways offered.

Student Population:

Current student enrollment is 2239. The ethnic breakdown is 75% African American, 18% Hispanic, 3% Asian, 1% Caucasian, 0.1% American Indian, and 3% Multi-racial.
