Charles W. Felker Dies in Milwaukee

Information has been received here of the death of Charles W. Felker, 58, Tuesday morning at his home in Milwaukee. Mr. Felker was a member of a prominent early Oshkosh family.

Son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Frederick Felker, he was educated in the public schools here, and following graduation from Oshkosh High School attended the University of Wisconsin. At the university, he was a member of Psi Upsilon Fraternity.

He was a veteran of World War I, having served with the artillery and infantry and attended officers training school. He was employed by New York Life Insurance Company in Oshkosh and affiliated with the same company during his residence in Milwaukee. It is believed that he moved to Milwaukee about 25 years ago.

Surviving are his wife, the former Florence Krumlauf, who taught at Oshkosh High School; two daughters, Mrs. Richard Adams, Appleton, and Mrs. Paul Strycker, Milwaukee; one son, Charles W. Felker Jr., Los Angeles; one sister, Mrs. Leo Black, Warsaw; one brother, John C. Felker, Western Springs, Ill.; one half - brother, John Eells, San Marino, Calif.; and six grandchildren.
