## **Annotation Strategies**

## The CATCH Strategy

- Circle unfamiliar words (then define them--use synonyms)
- Acknowledge confusion (and wrestle with it)
- Talk with text
  - comments
  - predictions
  - observations
  - connections
  - reactions
  - identify author's evidence/rhetorical devices
- Capture the main idea (main assertion--headline or subtitle?)
- Highlight important details

## **Believing/Doubting Game**

- 1. Read the article twice.
- 2. First, play the Believing Game (first and foremost trying to understand what the author is saying, and giving the author the benefit of the doubt).
- Then, read a second time playing the Doubting Game: ask questions, challenge the author's assumptions, and evaluate evidence.
- 4. Two ways to format: left/right margins (Believing/Doubting) or a separate T-Chart
