Although we cannot share private correspondence regarding collaborations, we can selectively quote from some forthcoming collaborations with high impact organisations:

We were endorsed by Robert Lempert and Steven Popper of the RAND Corporation, stating “where were you guys when we were in grad school!” as endorsement of our approaches in bringing their methods into new contexts for credible impact. We have been invited to give a seminar at the RAND Corporation as a result.
