Number of employees: The Door County Campus has 5 full time employees and 8 part time employees.

Number of volunteers: The Door County Campus has 40 active volunteers where about 25 volunteers work at the shelter on a weekly basis.

What is your Mission Statement?

To build a community where people value animals and treat them with respect and kindness.

What is the main source of your funding and what percent of your funding does that source provide?

Funding consists of 70% contributions from individuals, 19% grants/foundations, and 11% corporations.

Explanation of how you serve Northern Door County including primary programs your organization offers to the community.

The Wisconsin Humane Society operates shelters in Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Racine, Brown and Door Counties, as well as a spay/neuter clinic. WHS serves 40,000 animals annually, and adoption services are provided for nearly 13,000 animals each year. WHS provides educational programming for children, veterinary resources for animals in low-income households, social service programs, retail stores, volunteer programs, dog training classes, and a pet food bank for families experiencing temporary financial hardship.

The WHS Door County Campus provides housing for all lost and stray animals offering safe refuge for these animals while making every attempt to reunite them with their families. The Door County Campus also offers services for families who can no longer care for their animals, including veterinary medical care and adoption services. WHS provides compassionate, non-judgmental service that provides comfort to community residents who need to surrender an animal while ensuring the animals receive quality care in our shelter.

How would you define the impact your organization is making in Northern Door County?

The WHS Door County Campus is making an impact for Northern Door County by providing essential services for animals and the people who love them. WHS understands the impact of the human-animal bond and enriches the lives of Door County residents through adoption services and organizational volunteer opportunities. In 2019 there were 247 unique animal adoptions from the Door County Campus and 254 animals with foster placements.

What is your annual budget?

In 2019, Door County Campus operating expenses were approximately \$475,000.

If you were to receive a donation from 100+ WWC, how would that donation be used?

A generous donation from 100+ WWC would be used to care for lost and stray animals in Door County, and provide adoption services for homeless animals.
