

## **Wisconsin Humane Society - Door County Campus Summary**

**Number of employees:** The Door County Campus has 5 full time employees and 9 part time employees.

**Number of volunteers:** The Door County Campus has 32 active volunteers where about 14 volunteers work at the shelter on a weekly basis.

### **What is your Mission Statement?**

Our mission is to make a difference for animals and the people who love them.

### **What is the main source of your funding and what percent of your funding does that source provide?**

Contributions (including events and bequests) from generous individuals, foundations and corporations make up approximately 67% of our funding.

### **What is the geographic scope of your services throughout Door County?**

Services extend across the entire county.

### **Explanation of how you serve Door County including primary programs your organization offers to the community.**

WHS operates animal shelters in Milwaukee, Ozaukee, Racine, Kenosha, Door, and Brown Counties, as well as a spay/neuter clinic in West Allis. WHS annually serves more than 65,000 animals and their families.

Our services to the Door County community include:

An adoption program that matches animals with new families each year; we do not euthanize animals to make space in our shelters, and animals in our adoption program have as long as it takes to find a new home.

Stray/lost animal and law enforcement holding services for municipalities across Door County, which reunite hundreds of pets with their families each year.

Intake support and services for surrendered animals including partnership with the organization's Community Resource Navigator who connects individuals with existing outside programs that can support any identified areas of need.

Affordable vaccines and microchips through monthly clinics.

Pet food pantries that provide pet food, treats, and cat litter, etc. to bridge gaps in accessing these important resources.

A foster program for animals who need extra support or a break from the shelter.

Retail merchandise at our Animal Antics store onsite and online.



**How would you define the impact your organization is making in Door County?**

The Wisconsin Humane Society Door County Campus serves as a community resource to the residents of Door County and surrounding counties. In a 12-month period, the Door County Campus admits and cares for almost 900 unique animals. In FY25, we facilitated 362 adoptions to loving homes here in Door County, helped reconnect 128 pets to their owners through our stray partnerships, and supported families making the loving decision to surrender 261 animals. In our low-cost community vaccine clinics that occur monthly, we provided 389 animals with their vaccines keeping them healthy and supporting families to stay together through barrier reducing vet services.

**What is your annual budget?**

Our Door County Campus expenses for FY26 are \$433,137.

**If you were to receive a donation from 100+WWC, how would that donation be used?**

An award from the 100+ WWC will help the WHS Door County Campus to continue implementation of high operational standards, care for animals and families who need it most, providing people-centered service programs to pet owners in the community. Each individual animal in the care of WHS costs over \$500 for the duration of their stay, which includes veterinary services, surgery, food, shelter, and behavioral support. On average, dogs are with us for an average length of stay of 9 days and cats average 13 days in our care. Your gift provides core mission support to our operations at the WHS Door County Campus, veterinary medical care for animals, adoption services, support programs for families of owned animals, vaccine clinics, and spay/neuter assistance. Additionally, the WHS Door County Campus plays a unique role for the organization in serving as our ringworm treatment facility for all WHS shelter animals. WHS doesn't function as isolated shelters—we operate as a coordinated alliance of WHS Campuses bringing high quality care to all the animals and people we serve.
