Health Insurance

Pregnant women with income less than 253% of the FPL regardless of documentation status are able to apply for Medicaid. The typical 5-year wait time on applying to Medicaid for non-citizen individuals does not apply in case of pregnancy or if the individual is an asylee or refugee.

To be eligible for Rhode Island Medicaid, you must be a resident of the state of Rhode Island, a U.S. national, citizen, permanent resident, or legal alien, in need of health

care/insurance assistance, whose financial situation would be characterized as low income or very low income. You must also be one of the following:

- Pregnant, or
- Be responsible for a child 18 years of age or younger, or
- Blind, or
- Have a disability or a family member in your household with a disability, or
- Be 65 years of age or older.

In order to qualify, you must have an annual household income (before taxes) that is below the following amounts:

Federally Qualified Health Centers

Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) provide comprehensive primary care and other services that may include OB/GYN, mental health, dental, and optometry. They also have walk-in clinics at certain locations that do not require an appointment. The resources listed below have multiple sites. Please call to make an appointment and have a discussion about the best site for the client to go to given availability and convenience.

These FQHCs have interpreter services and offer sliding scale payment for those without insurance. Generally require patients to bring in some form of photo ID, but serve patients regardless of documentation and immigration status.
