[Online Accessibility Tools for Teaching and Learning](#)

This is an very informative 21 minute video on the resources for persons who may need accessibility access to digital tools. As you watch this video, make a list of the tools the author discusses along with a one-sentence description of what each tool does in terms of accessibility. I am aware that you are familiar with some of these tools but there are also ones that will be new to you. (50 points) (NOTE: you do not have to list all of the Google Tools as there will be an activity below related to this).

Google Docs- Google docs has a voice to text option for those who cant type.

Youtube- You can add subtitles to any videos so people who are deaf can still watch the videos.

Tech Smith/ Jing- You can make short videos for lessons for students who are visual learners.

Nuance- This is good for students who have movement problems.

Jaws- Its helps for students with vision problems. It reads everything.

South Carolina Talking Book Services- It reads everything for students with vision problems and blindness.

Hangouts meets- Allows people to come join a meeting without being there.
