Introduction: From
1775-1783 the British and the
Colonists fought in the
Revolutionary War. When the
war began, Britain seemed sure
to win based on the size of their
navy and well-trained,
professional army. The colonial
militia, known as the Continental
Army, was small and
inexperienced. The British won
several early battles, but over
time the Continental Army took
advantage of their strengths.



Task: Your task is to create a storyboard in which you research, summarize and draw 8 major battles of the American Revolution.

Procedure:

- 1. Select 8 Battles from the list to include chronologically in your storyboard.
 - a. The list is on the back of this page.
 - b. Everyone must start their storyboard with the <u>Battles of Lexington and Concord</u> and end with the Battle of Yorktown.
- 2. Begin researching your battles.
 - a. You should conduct all your research from the **Library Website** under **Research Databases**. Scroll down to History and use the **Gale History in Context Database**.
 - b. Answer the following questions for your storyboard:
 - i. Who were the Generals on both sides?
 - ii. Briefly describe the battle.
 - iii. Explain the outcome of the battle.
 - c. Research must be completed by Wednesday by the end of class
- 3. Create a Revolutionary War storyboard that includes ten scenes in chronological order (11X17 paper)
 - a. Storyboard contains a title scene and a name box at the end.
 - Each scene contains a drawing representative of the battle and a description including your research.
 - c. Each scene is creative, colorful and neat.
