

Creative Nonfiction Rubric: Food Writing

Quality of Ideas	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Choose an interesting topic● Try to stick to key pieces of information or interesting details● Try not to be very repetitive in your storytelling● Consider what will make your story relate to your audience and include that
Organization of Your Writing	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● The story is ordered in a way that makes sense/is logical● The story is organized in a way that is interesting or potentially surprising (if it fits the story)● The structure makes sense with the ideas.
Voice and Style	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● The writer comes through the writing● The style of the piece is interesting● The writer varies sentence structure to add variety to the piece of writing● Strong or interesting sentences draw attention to key content moments.● The writer uses imagery.
Word Choice	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● The words used to describe food or emotions are precise.● The writer shares details
Grammar and Mechanics	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Errors do not get in the way of understanding your message or interrupt the flow of your writing. <p>(Note: If students have dyslexia or dysgraphia, students' graders are not affected by errors.)</p>
