Unit 2 Lesson 12



Aim: Students will learn to identify and name common daily activities: eat, play with toys, watch TV, and sleep.

Time: 45-60 minutes

Tip: Use enthusiastic body language and facial expressions when demonstrating each activity. This helps keep young learners engaged and makes the lesson more interactive and fun. If possible, incorporate props or real objects related to each activity to make the learning experience more tangible.

Materials:

- AK Audio track
- Flashcards of daily activities (eat, play with toys, watch TV, sleep).
- Crayons or markers for tracing.
- Chart paper or a whiteboard for demonstration.

Engage:

Greet the students warmly.

Introduce the topic of the lesson by showing flashcards of daily activities (eat, play with toys, watch TV, sleep). Ask students what activities they do every day.

Explore & Practice:

With the Book

Show the book page and briefly describe each activity shown in the pictures.

Play an audio track that names each activity (eat, play with toys, watch TV, sleep). Have students listen carefully and trace the circle for each activity in their book. Provide guidance and demonstrate how to trace if needed.

Interactive Game

Play the recording again, and have students act it out (e.g., pretend to eat, play with toys, watch TV, or sleep) as they listen.

Charades and Guessing Activity

Choose a student to come to the front of the class. Show the student a flashcard (make sure the rest of the class can't see it). Ask the student to act out what's on the card without speaking. The rest of the class guesses the activity and calls it out. Continue until each student has had a turn to participate.

Closing:

Review

Go over each activity one more time, asking students to name them. Praise students for their participation and effort. Sing a short goodbye song with actions related to the activities learned.
