Rescue

God's Rescue Plan as demonstrated through the story of Zacchaeus. This lesson highlights how Jesus seeks and saves the lost.

Theme: God's Rescue Plan **Bible Passage:** Luke 19:1-10

Key Verse: Luke 19:10 - "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost." **Big Idea:** God's rescue plan involves seeking out and saving those who are far from

Him.

Lesson Objectives:

By the end of the lesson, students will:

- 1. Understand that Jesus came to rescue sinners.
- 2. Jesus is the Hebrew word for salvation or rescue.
- 3. Learn that no one is too lost for God's love.
- 4. Feel encouraged to accept Jesus' invitation to follow Him.

Lesson Outline

- 1. Welcome & Opening (10 minutes)
 - Greeting: Welcome each child warmly.
 - Prayer: Thank God for His love and plan to rescue us.
 - Icebreaker: "Have you ever climbed a tree? What did you see from up there?"
- 2. Bible Have students write CD1 92 by all scripture references so they can cross reference with their notebook.
 - Tell the Story (Luke 19:1-10):
 - Share how Zacchaeus was a tax collector who wasn't liked by others because he cheated people.
 - Explain how Zacchaeus climbed a tree to see Jesus because he was short.
 - Highlight how Jesus stopped, called Zacchaeus by name, and invited Himself to Zacchaeus' house.
 - Explain Zacchaeus' joyful response—he repented, promised to return what he had stolen, and gave generously.
 - End with Jesus' statement: "The Son of Man came to seek and save the lost."
 - Discussion Questions:
 - O Why did Zacchaeus climb the tree?
 - How did Zacchaeus change after meeting Jesus?
 - What does this story teach us about Jesus' love?
- 3. Activities (20 minutes)

Option 1: "Zacchaeus in the Tree" Craft

- Materials: Construction paper, markers, glue, popsicle sticks.
- **Activity:** Create a tree with Zacchaeus peeking out, reminding kids how Jesus sees and loves everyone.

Option 2: Seek and Save Game

• **Activity:** Hide paper hearts around the room. Let kids "seek" the hearts, representing Jesus seeking and saving the lost.

Option 3: Role Play

• Act out the story of Zacchaeus, with kids taking turns being Zacchaeus, Jesus, and the crowd.

4. Life Application (10 minutes)

- Discussion:
 - How does Jesus rescue us today?
 - o What should we do when we know Jesus loves us, just like Zacchaeus did?
- **Memory Verse Activity:** Write Luke 19:10 on a board and practice it with hand motions or as a call-and-response.

5. Closing (5 minutes)

- Review: Recap the story and main points.
- Prayer: Thank Jesus for rescuing us and ask for help to follow Him.

Take-Home Sheet: Include the memory verse, a summary of the story, and a coloring page of Zacchaeus in the tree.
