

Meeting of Committee on Observations and Networks (CON)
4th March 2025 16-17 CET / 10-11 am EST / 15-16 UTC
Telephone conference

- 1. Welcome and Review of Agenda Alice Bradley, Co-Chair of the Committee on Observations and Networks (CON) opened the meeting and a quick round of introductions took place (see Appendix 1 Participants). Jan Rene Larsen noted that the Minutes from the November CON meeting are available for review, and reminded participants that the CON teleconferences will be regularly scheduled on the first Tuesday of every second month. Given the number of new participants on today's call, Alice provided highlights from the November meeting that was the first meeting of this renewed CON and reviewed the discussion on CON goals as it re-establishes itself.
- 2. Introduce Plan for White Paper on Inventory Use Cases Alice noted that the preparation of a White Paper was identified at the November CON meeting as the first main effort of the renewed CON. The Paper could address questions such as: what does it mean to prepare an inventory; how is the scope determined; what are the practical aspects to be considered; who are using the inventories; how are the inventories being used; and, what needs to be included? The White Paper would then provide the necessary information to garner the most value from the inventories.

### 3. Deliberations on Use Cases -

a) <u>Lessons Learned</u>: Bill Manley presented on the <u>Polar Observing Assets Working</u> Group (POAWG) highlighting the use cases for the Registry of Polar Observing Networks - Ropon. He noted that both POAWG and Ropon are initiatives developed under the SAON CON. He described RoPON as a broad catalogue of systems and related organizations that coordinate or track observing activities and infrastructures in high latitudes. Bill noted that in the POAWG, "observing assets" are described as components of in situ observing, including either i) Infrastructure – sites and mobile platforms; or ii) Activities – projects, campaigns, initiatives. He noted the distinction that the RoPON registry is for networks only, with links to the networks and their data catalogs. Bill described the background work on user needs that was conducted to build the RoPON registry (including what should be included; how data should be presented; etc.) and then presented the compiled information on use cases for the RoPON inventories. Many of the uses related to identifying gaps, seeking collaborators, making connections, identifying relevant in situ measurements, who is actively working nearby, etc.

Bill continued to describe a separate initiative by the US AON on "Audience Poll Arctic Observing Inventories", that is separate from POAWG and RoPON. This new initiative is seeking to address the questions: how would you use an observing asset inventory; and what level of detail is important to you in such an inventory? In conclusion, Bill provided a series of recommendations to CON in moving forward with the inventories:

- Explicitly define what to inventory; i.e. define observational capacities;
- Make SAON CON's inventory interoperable with US AON's efforts for an inventory of observing assets;
- Engage with POAWG; and,
- Encourage sharing of observing-related metadata.

Alice thanked Bill for the presentation, noting how helpful and relevant this work is to the SAON CON and moving forward.

b) <u>Discussion on Uses of Inventories</u> – In preparation for today's meeting, participants had been asked to think about inventories and use cases in their respective context and experience. Alice started the discussion posing a series of questions on approach on potential use cases, asking who would use it? How would it be used? What should be included? What is the potential scope? Good discussion followed with examples of use cases provided by Rodica Nitu on the Mountain Research Initiative, Heikki Lihavainen and Bart Luks on SIOS, Hajo Eicken on the SAON ROADS Expert Panel (EP) on Salmon and possible future EPs.

In conclusion, Jan noted that the idea of making any CON inventory "use case driven" was demonstrated as very valuable. The work conducted by RoPON and POAWG has shown their expertise and capacity in working with inventories of networks. It was agreed that since CON is less experienced at this point, further discussion should take place to seek strong linkages and strengthen the work of RoPON and POAWG.

**Action:** Members are asked to identify observation inventories that they are aware of, or work with, - so that a list can be compiled that will be helpful to RoPON and more broadly. Alice offered to work with the listing of use cases developed for RoPON to possibly expand it for future discussion at the next CON meeting.

- Brief Presentations from Organizations Working on Inventories discussion postponed to future CON meetings
- Other Business Jan reported that the SAON Board will meet during the upcoming ASSW, and that the Board's discussions will focus on the SAON Committee work. CON members are welcome to attend the Board meeting on 23rd March 13:30 – 17:00 MDT / 20:30-24:00 CET.

The next CON meeting has been scheduled for 6th May 2025. Members were asked to watch for emails from today's discussions on follow-up actions.
