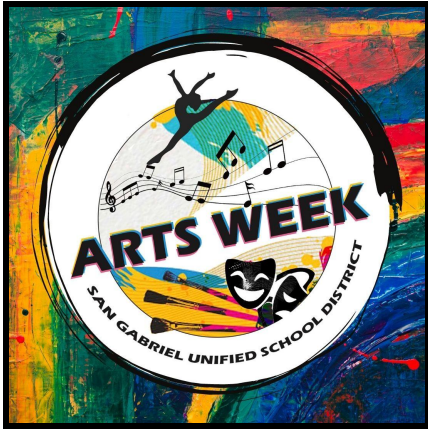




SGUSD Arts Week 2021 **Student Visual Art Contest Rules**

Theme: #SanGabrielExperience

What is it like to grow up and learn in San Gabriel? We want to see our community through your eyes. Each submission should reflect this theme.

1. Eligibility: Any TK – 12th grade student in the San Gabriel Unified School District may enter.
2. Accepted Mediums: drawing, painting, collage, photography, graphic design, sculpture.
3. All works will be submitted digitally.
4. One entry per student allowed.
5. Grade level categories: Grades TK-K, Grades 1-2, Grades 3-4, Grades 5-6, Grades 7-9, Grades 10-12
6. Prizes: 1st-3rd certificates will be awarded for all grades. 1st place winners in all categories will have their work exhibited at the SGUSD district office for one year.
7. Arts Week Showcase Award: All submissions will be considered for the top prize of “SGUSD Arts Week Showcase Award.” Winners of this award will receive a plaque and will have their work hung in the district exhibition for 1 year.
8. All submissions will be entered digitally and presented on the SGUSD VAPA website during Arts Week. Winning art that will be hung in the district exhibition will need to be matted and/or framed (sculpture will be photographed). After the completion of a year, students will have the option of donating their work to SGUSD, or have it returned.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

- Only new pieces of artwork inspired by current year’s theme may be submitted.
- Each entry must be the original work of one student only. An adult may not alter the integrity of a student’s work. Because the contest is designed to encourage and recognize each student’s individual creativity, help from an adult or collaboration with other students is not allowed.
- Other individuals may appear in or perform a student’s work, but the work itself must be the creative product of one student only.
- Only one student may be recognized as the award recipient for each entry. Why don't you send me your question When is changing Ava you got these ones in town already

- Entries must be accompanied by an “Artist’s Statement” of at least 10 words but no more than 200 words. The artists statement communicates what inspired the work, how it relates to the theme, and the content of the work. Both the title and the artist statement must be the work of the student who creates the work.
- Use of copyrighted material (images) or trademarks (company names, logos, brands, etc) is prohibited.
- Plagiarized entries will be disqualified.
- Content must not 1) promote illegal behavior; 2) support racial, religious, sexual or other invidious prejudice; 3) advocate sexual or violent exploitation; 4) violate rights established by law or agreements; 5) invade the privacy of any person; or 6) be otherwise inappropriate as delineated in school policy.
