<u>Important Information</u>

- How to Enter? ✓

- Post your design in the #map-designs channel of the official Risk Discord server
- This season's 6 finalists will be selected by guest judges from SMG, who have created the maps in Risk: Global Domination that we all know and love. Then it will be up to you, the Risk players, to vote for the 3 winners. \(\bigve{Y} \)
- Submissions will be open for 6 weeks, from the 23rd October to 3rd December
- Voting will start on 11th December
- Each participant may enter up to 3 separate designs, but can include multiple supporting images in the thread for each design.

- What constitutes a viable Risk Map? ✓

(There may be some room for exceptions if you ask beforehand and give specific reasons)

- **19-100** territories
- 4-14 continents
- Continent bonuses need to be worth 1-13 troops
- Each continent needs to contain **minimum** of **2** territories
- Continent boundaries are either visible in the main image, or an accompanying one
- Map needs to have a name
- Map should have a 1-2 line description that would display in the map selection screen of Risk
- Playable within the rules of Risk: Global Domination

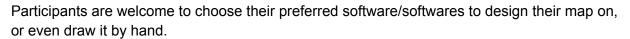
- Recommended Optional features 🗸

- Continents need to have names
- Territories need to have names
- It's recommended that you post **Rough sketches** from your design process
- Write **1-2 paragraphs** about your idea, theme, inspirations and map strategy
- Accompanying image displaying territory connections, if it's not visible from main image
- Map pack name for the Map/Maps you made (either an existing pack you'd like to see it added to, or a name for a new pack it could fit in)

- High-level Optional Features V

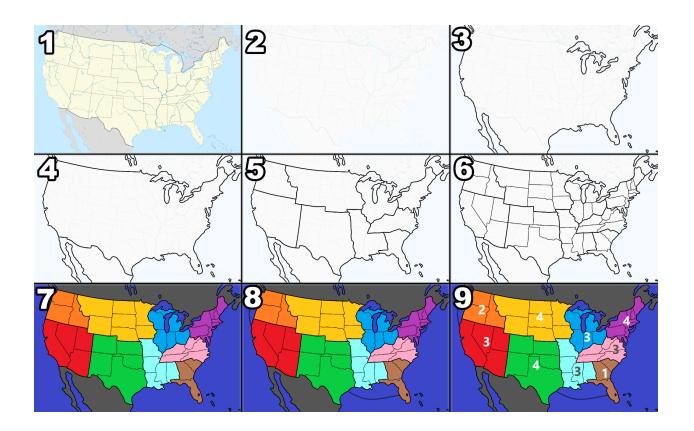
- Card sketches that match your theme
- An Advanced version of your map
- A **Simplified**, small version of your map
- Some Artistic features on the map, like the 3D great wall in Qing Dynasty, London Eye in 28 Turns Later or Trojan horse in Troy
- Other features from the Bonus Info section

Make your Own Map!



- With Paint 3D

- 1. Find **either** a map of the place you'd like to make a map of, **or** if it is less of a geographic region, a rough sketch of your map idea (Make sure your map is **NOT** a Risk map already!)
- 2. Now, use your **paint bucket** and fill the entire image to an opacity where you can just **barely** still mark out the borders you will trace.
- 3. Begin by tracing the **oceanic borders** to your map.
- 4. Now, trace the **land boundaries** of your map,
- 5. Shortly followed by creating your **region borders**.
- 6. Last time tracing, I promise! Outline **your territories** for the map.
- 7. Here's the fun part! **Fill in** your territories with the colors of your choice.
- 8. Now, create your ocean and land routes.
- 9. Finally, it's **up to you** how you decide to show **continent bonuses** (Believe me, I've gone through alot of options.) The easiest is to show them by text boxes on the regions, but it's completely your choice.



Countries/Cities Theme

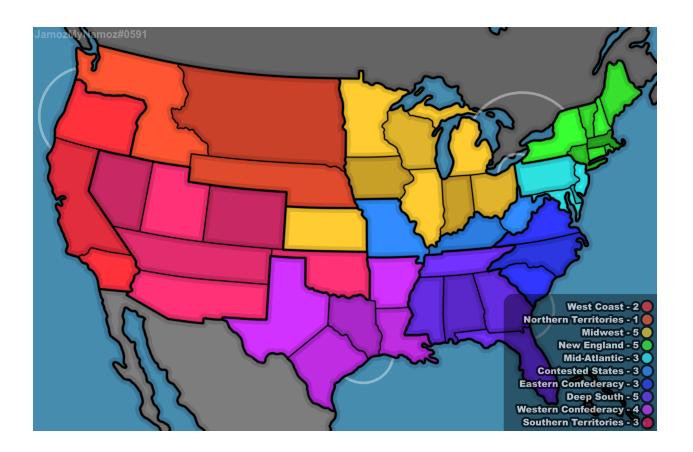

DESCRIPTION

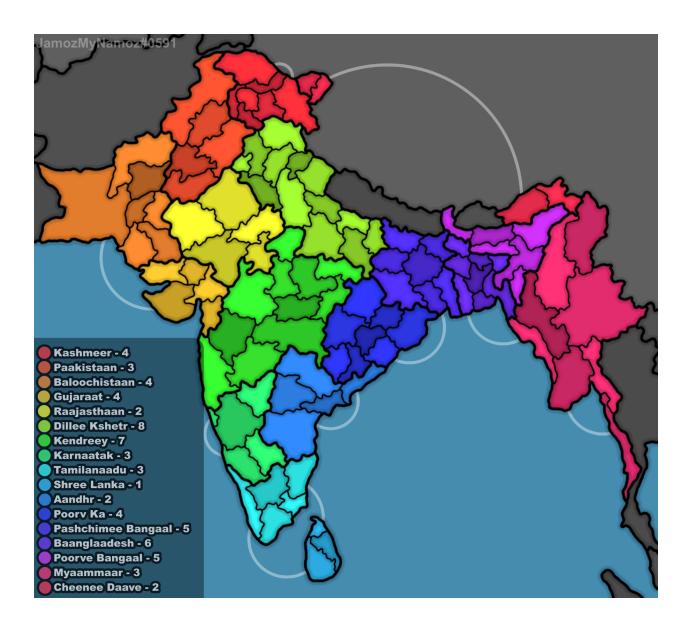

DESCRIPTION

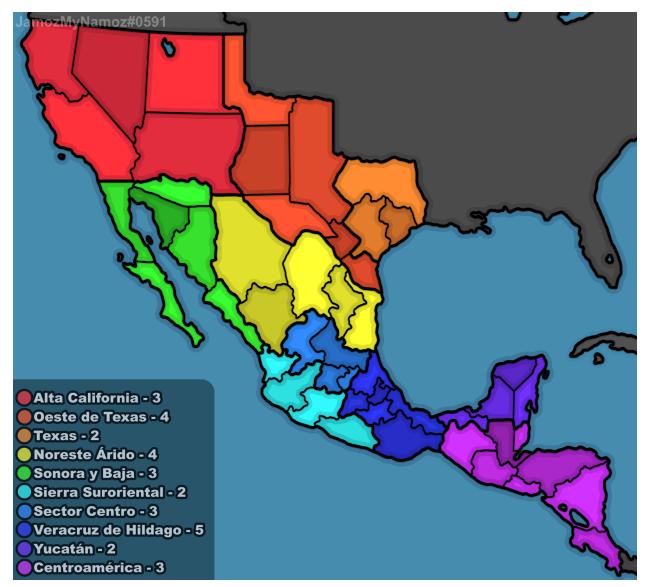
India and its border states are now compiled into one region for conquering! Instability is a large problem, however, and it doesn't seem this region will be united for long...

Beware of Mountains! This map has a "Mountainous" mechanic, meaning some provinces will not border each other as usual!

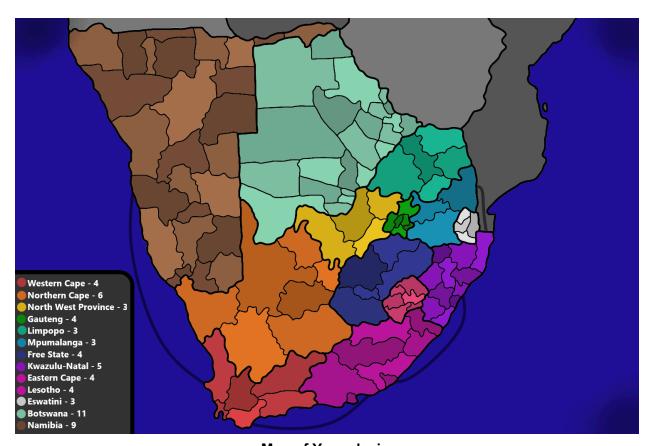

Map of South Africa Advanced

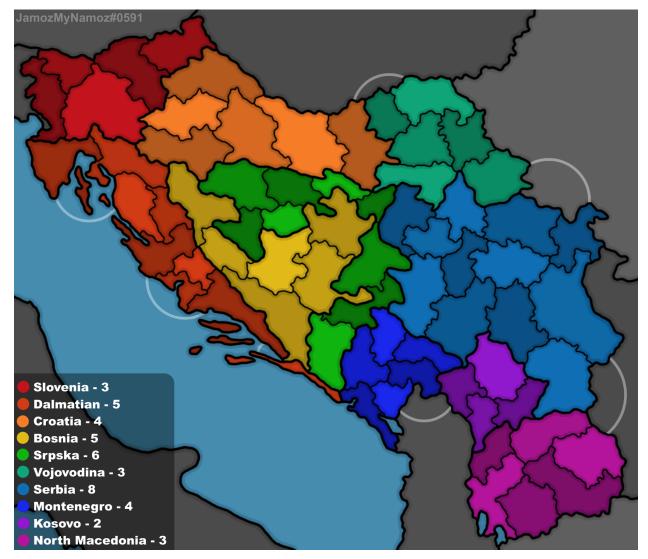
This map is part of a map pack being made as a part of a friendly competition with @SugaNOPE.

Map of Yugoslavia

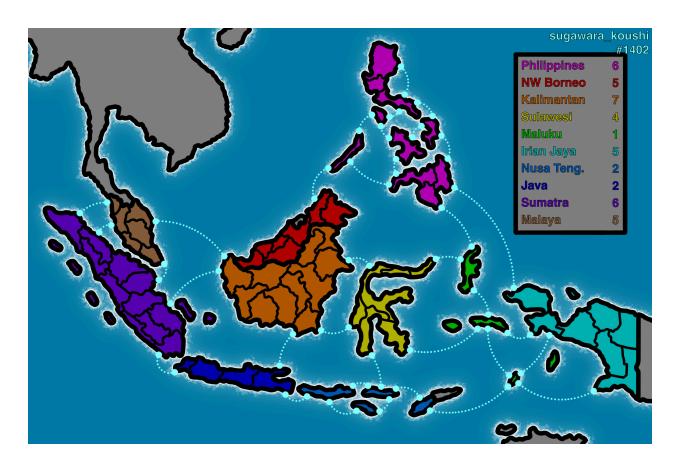

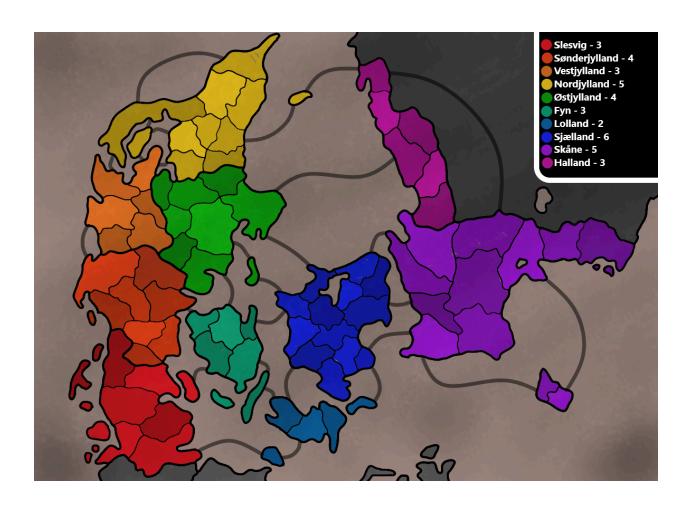
Map of Maphilindo

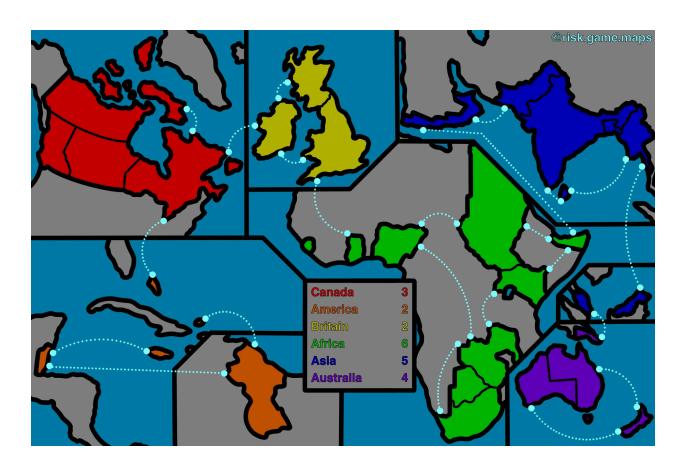

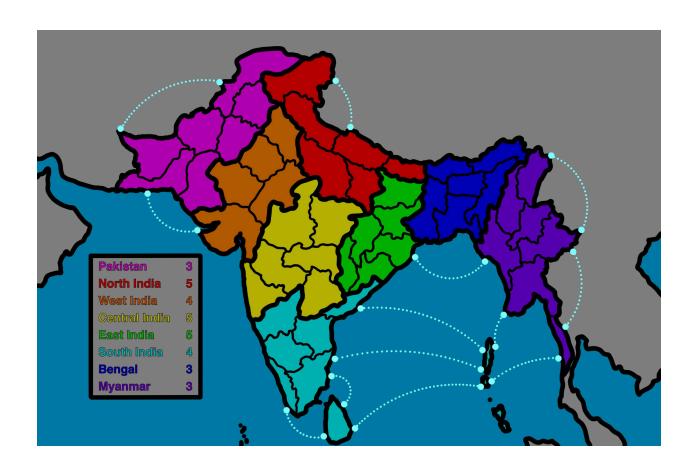
Map of the Danish Empire | Part of the Designer Duel 2 Map Pack

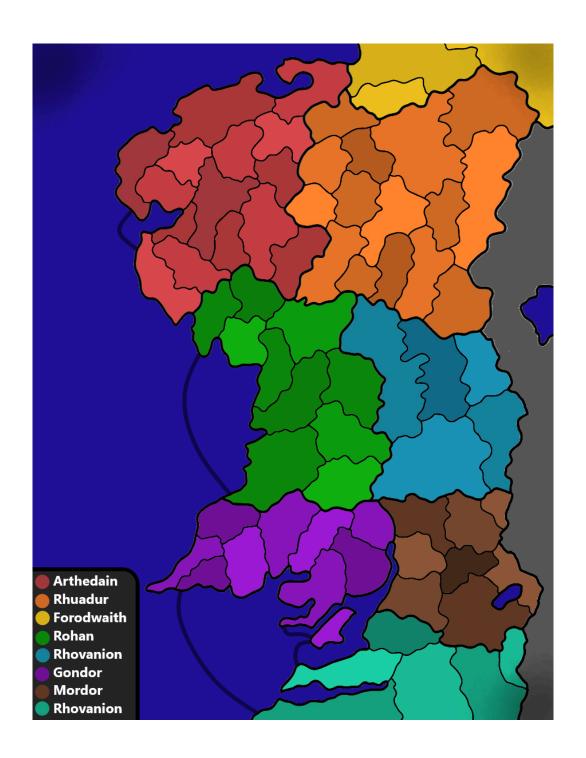

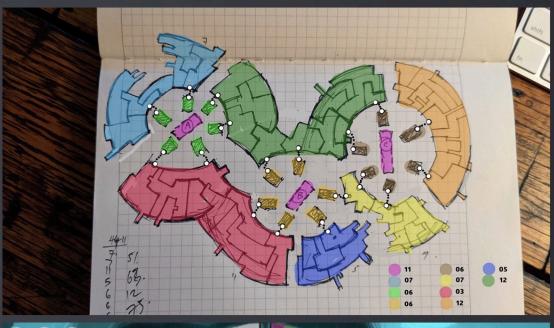

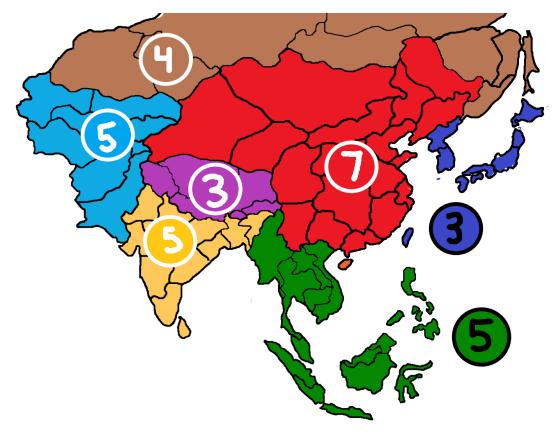




Modern Asia map.

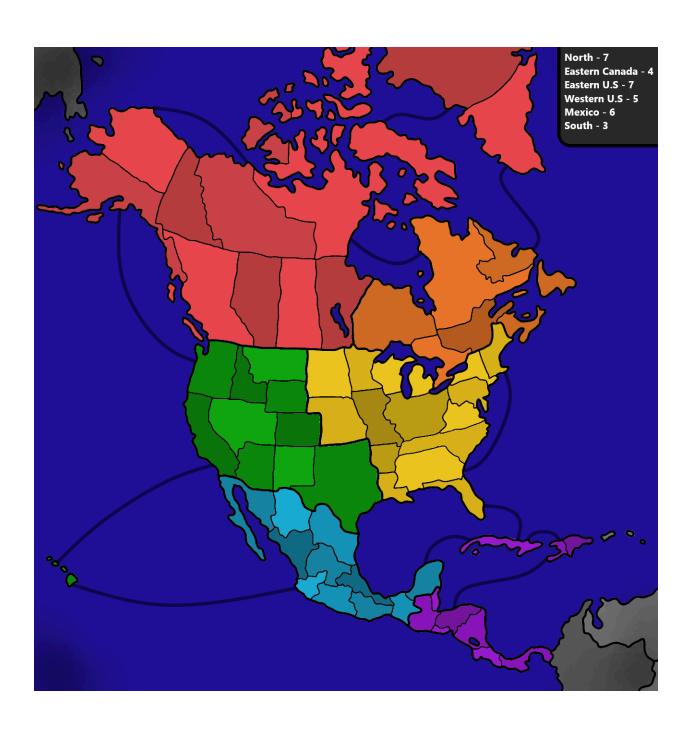

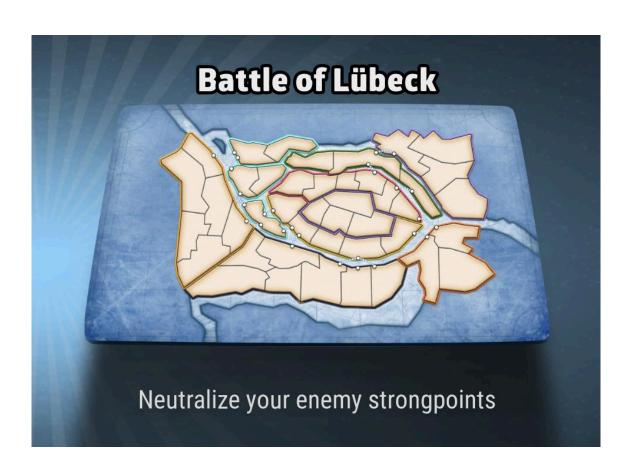


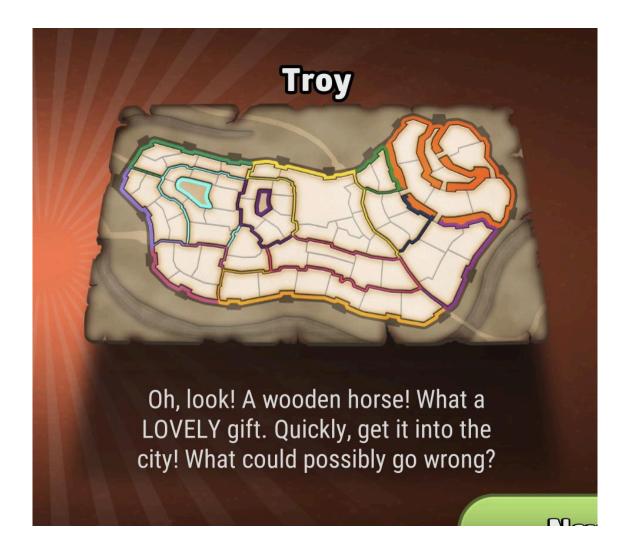

Important Rules

- No Plagiarism X

Any direct plagiarism is obviously prohibited, other details include:

- Using any kind of design that can be found somewhere else online is **not** allowed. (please avoid posting your design elsewhere until after the competition, to avoid triggering plagiarism checks)
- Getting someone else to design the map for you is against the rules.
- **Reposting** an idea you have already made for something else is not permitted.
- Any other unfair way of copying someone else's design to use as your own is not allowed

- Bad Tracing X

We recognise that **tracing outlines** of maps and photos is a **standard method** of starting a Risk design, but we will be monitoring it closely to avoid **plagiarism**

- Tracing from maps of real places is allowed, but avoid tracing other people's artwork or intellectual property
- Any traced images must be submitted to staff for checks, along with links
- No tracing a Risk map, or map designed for any game similar to Risk
- If tracing an image, your final design can't be excessively similar to the source image, e.g. you should change some lines, add your own colors, continent borders etc.
- No tracing images with large water-marks that clearly don't want to be copied
- When tracing, **do not copy** its name or description

- Low-effort X

- No low-effort posts that look like they took less than an hour to make
- **Not every entry** needs to be a masterpiece (and it shouldn't be), but pieces should demonstrate that the participant has at least made a decent effort to put up something of **quality** together, that's worth posting for community votes.
- Maps must be viable to feature in Risk.

- No breaking TOS X

Breaking server rules and/or TOS is not allowed

- Any form of NSFW content is denied
- Non-family-friendly content is not tolerated
- Nothing rude or insulting in the Server
- Any kind of advertising in the entry is prohibited
- Troll entries are not permitted
- Including any random irrelevant images as part of your design is against the rules

- spamming for votes X

- Don't **ping members for votes**, especially mass pings like Everyone, Looking For Game etc.
- Don't start new DMs to **solicit votes**. DMing a few friends that you already had ongoing DM conversations with before the tournament started is fine.
- No telling people **not to vote** for, or to **unvote** your competitor's designs
- No **requesting collusion**, e.g. by offering other designers that you'll vote on for them if they vote for you.
- No adding alts or other Discord accounts to the server for the specific purpose of upvoting your idea.
- No otherwise **shady** or **loophole** methods of gaining votes, that staff don't deem as fair.

- excessively controversial designs X

- Discussing politics in the Risk Discord server is against the rules, so if you see a design you think is politically charged, DM staff privately, and do not start a public argument about the politics of the map.
- Trigger warning: there may be some maps that you don't like or agree with. It's important to remember these are works of art by the designers, and their designs aren't officially endorsed by the organizers of this event.
- Maps of countries involved in especially controversial conflicts in 2023 may be removed, especially if they start arguments in the server https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List of ongoing armed conflicts
- Other maps may be removed, if deemed inappropriate by staff for any reason
- Speak to staff if you're unsure whether your map idea is appropriate

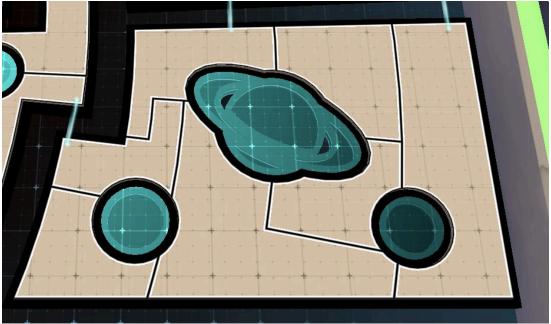

Inspiring Features From Risk 💡

• Learning from the best, can help inspire your own ideas. Here are some of my favorite little that help bring maps to life:

Playing with Dead-Space: try getting creative with the shapes of the gaps between your territories





Using natural features to your advantage: Mountains, Rivers, Lakes and other natural wonders can create exciting chokepoints, and impassable areas, deepening the map's strategic complexity





Bridges and river crossings add important bottlenecks on the map to control

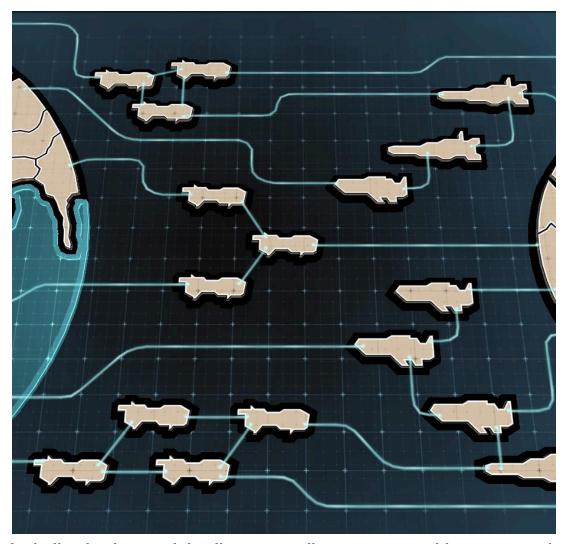




Sea lanes, to connect islands and non-adjacent territories







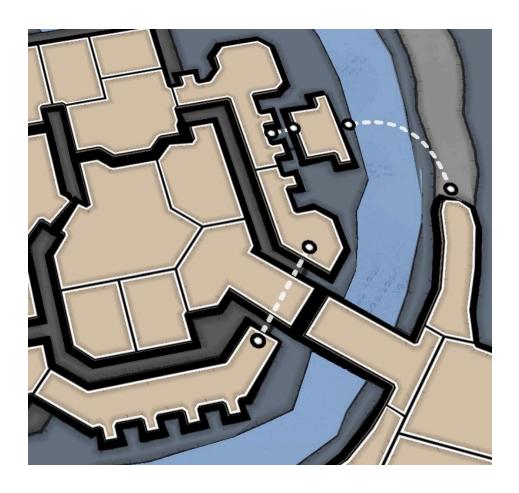
Including background details, surrounding your map, adds context and style. On maps like the Ottoman Empire, I love how they've softly included the surrounding countries, and added a compass to give a real map feel.

End of the king is tucked snuggly into a mountain and port.





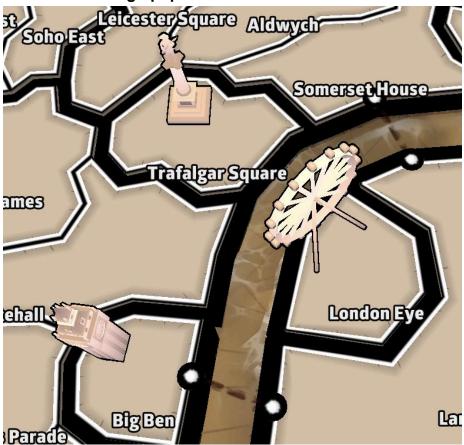
The drawbridge connection on Castle, making a connection between 2 territories, that jumps over another territory, really stands out as a simple but creative way to make this map strategically unique.



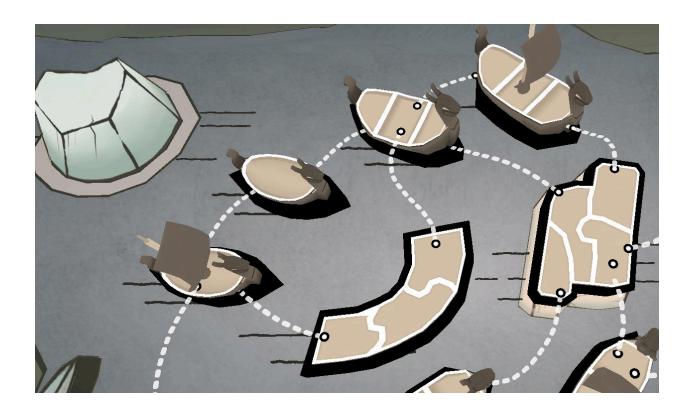
Bonuses made of separated territories, such as the Towers Bonus of Conwy Castle (in yellow here), introduce a very different strategy to connected bonuses, and give players something extra to think about.



3D features, especially ones that match the theme of what the map's about, help to make the design pop out



A territory doesn't have to be a piece of land, even a boat can be a territory, so perhaps there are even more possibilities for what a territory can be

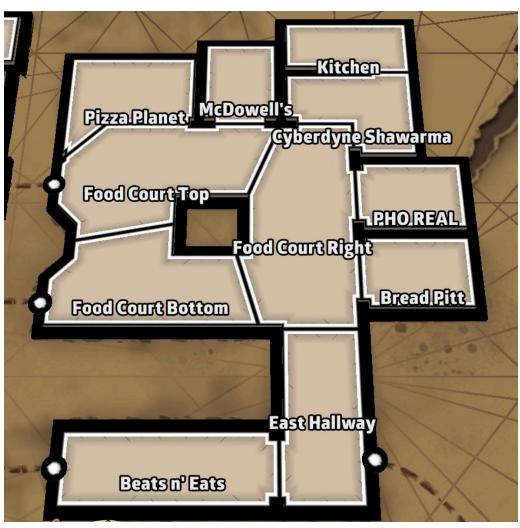


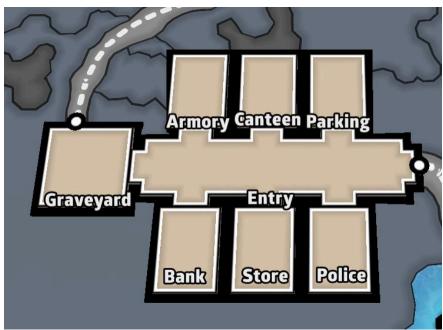
Visual symmetry, combined with tactical asymmetry. Maps like these have an eye-catching element of symmetry, bit once you start to explore them, there's more little differences than initially meets the eye





Dead-Ends: Territories with only 1 connection can be very important as kill-guards, troop-splits, and places to hide.





Nexus points: Territories that connect to a lot of other territories, and often create chokepoints, can become key tactical areas of control. A lot of the best map designs not only include deadends, but contrast those with nexuses, and a range of territories with different connection levels in between.

How many different territories does this Brazil territory on Pangaea have?





Map within a map: very high level skill, to impress audiences, if you're putting together a whole map pack

Take for example the Enchanted Realms Map pack. Can you find its 3 other maps, hidden as Easter Eggs inside the Overworld map? Do you know which other map pack has this feature too?









Giving a fancy edge to your map design can style it to fit your theme. Consider how you want your map to feel: classic, ancient, cold, fantasy, futuristic, or something different?
