#### YOUR COMMITMENT

Being a small group leader is more than an hour-long commitment, as we're sure you're aware. Here are the basic required elements of a small group leader commitment:

- Your own weekly small group (and planning time). (1.5 hours)
- Leaders meetings on Sunday nights from 7:00-8:30pm. (~8 meetings per semester).
- Wednesday Service at 7pm. (1.5 hours)
- Sunday Service at 10:30am. (1.5 hours)
- Prayer at the CCF House once/week, either Monday evening or Tues/Thurs morning. (0.5 hours)

In addition to these specified meetings, as a representative of CCF we expect you to be involved and invested in CCF generally, making an honest effort to participate in other CCF activities (e.g., retreats, weekend events, Spring Break Trip, etc.). While *being present* at these events is important, we understand genuine investment to be borne out of love and concern for the students of CCF. To that end, we expect you not to attend only as a passive consumer but to be *fully engaged*, eyes open to how you may serve and actively participate (meeting someone new, washing dishes, etc.).
