I earned my Bachelor of Science in Nursing from the University of Ghana, Legon. Following my national service, I was posted to a high-acuity medical ward, where my clinical competence, initiative, and teamwork were recognised. I was later transferred to the surgical unit, where I took on pre-operative and post-operative patient care, discharge planning, and mentorship of newly posted nurses. These diverse experiences helped me develop key competencies in patient assessment, care planning, clinical reasoning, and ethical decision-making.

Beyond clinical duties, I have participated in internal quality improvement initiatives aimed at reducing hospital-acquired infections and improving patient satisfaction. These engagements

sparked my interest in evidence-based practice and the broader impact of clinical leadership. However, I have encountered recurring limitations in scope—particularly the inability to independently assess, diagnose, prescribe, or coordinate advanced interventions. These limitations have only reinforced my desire to become an Advanced Clinical Practitioner capable of leading change, delivering high-level care, and supporting system-wide improvements.
