

## **Bills LWVTX Opposed that Died**

## Bills with companion bills that passed are denoted in red\*

- <u>HB 6</u> Cain Omnibus bill with penalty increases and other vote suppressive measures **(T)**, inserted into SB 7 (also dead)
- HB 463 Shaheen Blocking individuals with felony convictions from being poll watchers (C)
- HB 530 Patterson Allowing election judges to carry a handgun at the polling place
- HB 611 Swanson Requiring a voter assistance oath and creating criminal penalties
- <u>HB 782</u> Swanson Providing for SOS review of municipal ballot propositions & more re: petitions to call referenda
- HB 895 Swanson Allowing election clerks to take photos of people suspected of fake IDs (T)
- HB 1026 Middleton Giving SOS all voter registration power (T)
- HB 1725 Paul Limiting In-person delivery of VBM ballots (T)
- HB 2092 Sanford Requiring local electeds declare party affiliation
- HB 2293 Patterson Setting voting hours of 6 am 9 pm
- HB 2320 Jetton Forbidding pre-filling any item on a vote by mail application (ABBM)
- <u>HB 2339</u> Klick Requiring any non-citizen/non-resident jury notice replies to lose voter regis.
- <u>HB 2478</u> Harris Including a copy of voter ID with ABBM / companion <u>SB 1509</u> Creighton (also dead) **(T)**
- HB 2546 Jetton Adding SOS voter regis roll maintenance, penalties and other provisions
- HB 3080 Oliverson Prohibiting the mailing of unsolicited ABBMs and setting penalties
- <u>HB 3269</u> Noble Requiring unvoted VBM ballots be returned to polling place; if no ballot return, must provisionally vote
- HB 3281 Paul Adding restrictive VBM provisions
- HB 3297 Allison Adding more election fraud definitions and criminal penalties
- HB 3424 Slawson Adding more fraud definitions and providing for civil penalties
- <u>HB 3974</u> Paul Adding residential address restrictions to confirm voter regis [companion bill SB 1111 ENROLLED]
- HB 3999 Jetton Allowing alternate election judges to appoint their own clerks
- <u>HB 4044</u> Cain Requiring some voter registration cancellations, companion <u>SB 1113</u> ENROLLED]
- HB 4251 Toth Making voter registration in libraries optional
- HB 4322 Jetton Allowing polling places only in permanent structures (T)
- HB 4331 Jetton Adding more criminal and civil penalties for vote harvesting
- HB 4364 Jetton Creating penalties for interfering with poll watchers (T)
- HB 4366 Jetton/HB 4507 Schofield Setting up separate federal and state elections
- <u>HB 4369</u> Noble/<u>SB 1664</u> Bettencourt Calling for more intensive signature review of mail ballots
- HB 4480 Hefner Adding election fraud definition language and civil penalties
- SB 7 Hughes Omnibus bill with many unneeded restrictions, vote suppression and penalties

THE GOVERNOR SIGNED ALL BILLS MENTIONED AS ENROLLED AND BECOME EFFECTIVE SEPT 1, 2021.



- SB 155 Perry Adding provisions related to citizenship and voter registration roll cleansing
- SB 1112 Bettencourt Adding more early voting restrictions and criminal penalties
- <u>SB 1114</u> Bettencourt/SB 1235 Hughes Requiring SOS verify citizenship accuracy of DPS voter registrations
- <u>SB 1340</u> Buckingham Making SOS the only voter registrar and a form of online voter registration through DPS **(T)**
- <u>SB 1430</u> Bettencourt/<u>HB 782</u> Swanson Sending municipal proposition election descriptions to SOS for review (also dead)
- SB 1509 Creighton Requiring copies of voter ID along with ABBMs and VBM ballots
- SB 1589 Bettencourt Creating an election police force
- <u>SB 1675</u> Campbell Prohibiting the Governor from loosening any VBM procedures
- <u>SB 2256</u> Hughes Setting up separate voter registration systems for federal and state elections (see also <u>HB 4366</u>)
- <u>SJR 51</u> Creighton Calling for Constitutional amendment to prohibit unsolicited distribution of ABBMs
- <u>SJR 61</u> Campbell Calling for Constitutional amendment to prohibit any temporary suspension of VBM procedures except by legislation
