THE AMERICAN STUDIES PROGRAM AT IUPUI

#### **Overview**

The American Studies doctoral program at IUPUI in partnership with IUPUI's Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, and the National Council on Public History announces the sponsorship of a full-time PhD track in area of Diversity and Public History. The track invites investigation into how diversity and inclusion are understood and made manifest in a campus, a city, and a national organization.

### Goals

- 1. Leverage academic disciplines in and related to <u>public history</u> that provide training related to diversity on campuses and in communities
- 2. Develop tools to evaluate ideas, practices, and outcomes related diversity and inclusion in the areas of academia and civic culture

## **Specifications**

This program offers funding for a \$15,000/year graduate assistantship in the Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, and tuition remission for four years of doctoral coursework, research, and writing.

### **Application and Recruitment**

This program encourages applications from people who have previous experience in the area of diversity and inclusion within academia or civic life. The program also encourages those with at least one advanced degree (up to 30 hours from previous graduate work can be counted toward the PhD) to apply.

## II. Degree Requirements

The doctoral program distributes credit hours by thirds (in general): one-third in courses, one-third in internship or project-based hours, and one-third in dissertation hours. Other than two required, common courses, coursework is specific to a student's focus.
