Play Guess the Covered Word. Use a piece of paper and cover the word on a page that matches the picture. Have someone at home guess all the possibilities. Slowly show them the word. Repeat.	If there is a pattern in the book, can you write your own book using that pattern. For instance, if the book says, "The dad is asleep. The mom is asleep." You could write your own book using "The dog is asleep. The cat is asleep."	Draw a picture and/or write a new ending for the book. How might it go?	What kinds of characters did the author create?
